A BILL

To prohibit the import, export, sale, purchase, possession, transportation, acquisition, and receipt of bear viscera

or products that contain or claim to contain bear viscera, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Bear Protection Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 6 Congress finds that—
- 7 (1) there are eight extant species of bear: Asian
- 8 black bear, brown bear, polar bear, American black
- 9 bear, spectacled bear, giant panda, sun bear, and
- 10 sloth bear;
- 11 (2) the Asian black bear populations have been
- decimated in recent years by illegal trade to supply
- the growing demand for medicines and cosmetics
- 14 containing valuable bear viscera;
- 15 (3) without immediate action to end United
- 16 States involvement in the lucrative black market
- 17 trade in bear viscera, American bear populations
- 18 may suffer the same devastating losses as Asian
- 19 bear populations;
- 20 (4) increasingly, undercover operations have
- 21 discovered that poachers are establishing extensive
- 22 smuggling networks to illegally commercialize Amer-
- 23 iean bears;

- (5) because it is practically impossible to distinguish the viscera of CITES appendix I bears from the viscera of other bear species, there is an urgent need to eliminate the trade in the viscera of all bear species;
 - (6) as a party to CITES, a world leader in wildlife conservation, and a large market for and supplier of bear viscera and products, the United States shares responsibility for supporting and implementing measures to stop the illegal trade in CITES appendix I Asian black bears and CITES appendix II American black bears;
 - (7) inconsistency in State prohibition of commercialization of bear gall and inadequate Federal regulation of such commercialization make law enforcement difficult; and
 - (8) individual States, which have the right to set, maintain, and enforce quotas for the legal hunting of black bears, will be assisted in their management efforts by the enactment of a Federal law banning the import of, export of, and interstate commerce in bear viscera.

1 SEC. 3. PURPOSE.

- 2 The purpose of this Act is to ensure the long-term via-
- 3 bility of the world's eight bear species and specifically to
- 4 perpetuate healthy populations of American bears.

5 SEC. 4. STATEMENT OF POLICY.

- 6 It is the policy of the United States that effective
- 7 long-term conservation of the world's bear species, includ-
- 8 ing North American bears, depends in part on the prohibi-
- 9 tion of the lucrative trade in bear viscera.

10 SEC. 5. DEFINITIONS.

- 11 In this Act:
- 12 (1) BEAR VISCERA.—The term "bear viscera"
- 13 means the body fluids or internal organs (including
- the gallbladder) of a species of bear.
- 15 (2) CITES.—The term "CITES" means the
- 16 Convention on International Trade in Endangered
- 17 Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, done at Washing-
- 18 ton on March 3, 1973 (27 UST 1087; TIAS 8249).
- 19 (3) OTHER TERMS.—The terms "import", "per-
- 20 son", "State", and "transport" have the meanings
- 21 provided in section 2 of the Lacey Act Amendments
- 22 of 1981 (16 U.S.C. 3371).

23 SEC. 6. PROHIBITED ACTS.

24 A person who—

1	(1) imports into the United States, or exports
2	from the United States, bear viscera or products
3	that contain or claim to contain bear viscera; or
4	(2) sells, barters, offers to sell or barter, pur-
5	chases, possesses with intent to sell or barter, trans-
6	ports, acquires, or receives in interstate or foreign
7	commerce, bear viscera or products that contain or
8	elaim to contain bear viscera;
9	shall be subject to section 7(a).
10	SEC. 7. PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT.
11	(a) In General.—A person who engages in conduct
12	described in section 6 shall be subject to the penalties and
13	sanctions provided in sections 4 and 5 of the Lacey Act
14	Amendments of 1981 (16 U.S.C. 3373 and 3374).
15	(b) Enforcement.—
16	(1) In General.—This Act shall be enforced in
17	the manner provided in subsections (a), (b), and (e)
18	of section 6 of the Lacey Act Amendments of 1981
19	(16 U.S.C. 3375).
20	(2) Use of penalty amounts for rewards
21	AND INCIDENTAL EXPENSES.—Amounts received as
22	penalties, fines, or forfeiture of property under sub-
23	section (a) shall be used in accordance with section
24	6(d) of the Lacey Act Amendments of 1981 (16

U.S.C. 3375(d)).

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1	SEC. 8. DISCUSSIONS CONCERNING TRADE PRACTICES.
2	(a) In General.—The Secretary of the Interior and
3	the United States Trade Representative shall—
4	(1) discuss issues involving trade in bear viscera
5	with the appropriate representatives of such coun-
6	tries trading with the United States as are deter-
7	mined jointly by the Secretary of the Interior and
8	the Secretary of Commerce to be the leading import-
9	ers, exporters, or consumers of bear viscera; and
10	(2) attempt to establish coordinated efforts with
11	the countries to protect bears.
12	(b) REPORT.—Not later than 5 years after the date
13	of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Interior
14	shall submit to Congress a report describing the progress
15	of efforts to end illegal trade in bear viscera.
16	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
17	This Act may be cited as the "Bear Protection Act of
18	1998".
19	SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
20	Congress finds that—
21	(1) all 8 extant species of bear—Asian black
22	bear, brown bear, polar bear, American black bear,
23	spectacled bear, giant panda, sun bear, and sloth

bear—are listed on Appendix I or II of the Conven-

tion on International Trade in Endangered Species of

- Wild Fauna and Flora (27 UST 1087; TIAS 8249)
 (referred to in this section as "CITES");
- (2) Article XIV of CITES provides that Parties 3 4 to CITES may adopt stricter domestic measures re-5 garding the conditions for trade, taking, possession, or 6 transport of species on Appendix I or II, and the 7 Parties to CITES adopted a resolution (Conf. 10.8) 8 urging Parties to take immediate action to demon-9 strably reduce the illegal trade in bear parts and de-10 rivatives:
 - (3) the Asian bear populations have declined significantly in recent years, as a result of habitat loss and poaching due to a strong demand for bear viscera used in traditional medicines and cosmetics;
 - (4) while most American black bear populations are generally stable or increasing, commercial trade could stimulate poaching and threaten certain populations if the demand for bear viscera increases; and
 - (5) prohibitions against the importation into the United States and exportation from the United States of bear viscera and products containing bear viscera will assist in ensuring that the United States does not contribute to the commercial trade in bear viscera.

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1	SEC. 3. PURPOSES.
2	The purpose of this Act is to ensure the long-term via-
3	bility of the world's 8 bear species by—
4	(1) prohibiting international trade in bear
5	viscera and products containing bear viscera;
6	(2) encouraging bilateral and multilateral efforts
7	to eliminate such trade; and
8	(3) ensuring that adequate Federal legislation
9	exists with respect to domestic trade in bear viscera
10	and products containing bear viscera.
11	SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.
12	In this Act:
13	(1) Bear viscera.—The term "bear viscera"
14	means the body fluids or internal organs, including
15	the gallbladder and its contents but not including
16	blood, of a species of bear.
17	(2) Import.—The term "import" means to land
18	on, bring into, or introduce into any place subject to
19	the jurisdiction of the United States, whether or not
20	the landing, bringing, or introduction constitutes an
21	importation within the meaning of the customs laws
22	of the United States.
23	(3) Person.—The term "person" means—
24	(A) an individual, corporation, partnership,

trust, association, or other private entity;

1	(B) an officer, employee, agent, department,
2	or instrumentality of—
3	(i) the Federal Government;
4	(ii) any State, municipality, or politi-
5	cal subdivision of a State; or
6	(iii) any foreign government;
7	(C) a State, municipality, or political sub-
8	division of a State; and
9	(D) any other entity subject to the jurisdic-
10	tion of the United States.
11	(4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
12	the Secretary of the Interior.
13	(5) State.—The term "State" means a State,
14	the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puer-
15	to Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, Commonwealth of
16	the Northern Mariana Islands, American Samoa, and
17	any other territory, commonwealth, or possession of
18	the United States.
19	(6) Transport.—The term "transport" means
20	to move, convey, carry, or ship by any means, or to
21	deliver or receive for the purpose of movement, con-
22	veyance, carriage, or shipment.
23	SEC. 5. PROHIBITED ACTS.
24	A person shall not—

1 (1) import into, or export from, the United 2 States bear viscera or any product, item, or substance derived from bear viscera; or 3 (2) sell or barter, offer to sell or barter, purchase, 5 possess, transport, deliver, or receive in foreign com-6 merce bear viscera or any product, item, or substance 7 derived from bear viscera. 8 SEC. 6. PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT. 9 (a) Criminal Penalties.—A person that knowingly 10 violates section 5 shall be fined under title 18, United States Code, imprisoned not more than 1 year, or both. 12 (b) Civil Penalties.— 13 (1) Amount.—A person that knowingly violates 14 section 5 may be assessed a civil penalty by the Sec-15 retary of not more than \$25,000 for each violation. 16 Manner of assessment and collec-17 TION.—A civil penalty under this subsection shall be 18 assessed, and may be collected, in the manner in 19 which a civil penalty under the Endangered Species 20 Act of 1973 may be assessed and collected under sec-21 tion 11(a) of that Act (16 U.S.C. 1540(a)). 22 (c) Products, Items, and Substances.—Any bear 23 viscera, or any product, item, or substance sold, imported, or exported, or attempted to be sold, imported, or exported,

in violation of this section (including any regulation issued

- 1 under this section) shall be seized and forfeited to the United
- 2 States.
- 3 (d) Regulations.—After consultation with the Sec-
- 4 retary of the Treasury, the Secretary of Health and Human
- 5 Services, and the United States Trade Representative, the
- 6 Secretary shall issue such regulations as are necessary to
- 7 carry out this section.
- 8 (e) Enforcement.—The Secretary, the Secretary of
- 9 the Treasury, and the Secretary of the department in which
- 10 the Coast Guard is operating shall enforce this section in
- 11 the manner in which the Secretaries carry out enforcement
- 12 activities under section 11(e) of the Endangered Species Act
- 13 of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1540(e)).
- 14 (f) Use of Penalty Amounts.—Amounts received as
- 15 penalties, fines, or forfeiture of property under this section
- 16 shall be used in accordance with section 6(d) of the Lacey
- 17 Act Amendments of 1981 (16 U.S.C. 3375(d)).
- 18 SEC. 7. DISCUSSIONS CONCERNING TRADE PRACTICES.
- 19 The Secretary and the Secretary of State shall discuss
- 20 issues involving trade in bear viscera with the appropriate
- 21 representatives of countries trading with the United States
- 22 that are determined by the Secretary and the United States
- 23 Trade Representative to be the leading importers, exporters,
- 24 or consumers of bear viscera, and attempt to establish co-
- 25 ordinated efforts with the countries to protect bears.

1 **SEC. 8. REPORT.**

2	(a) In General.—Not later than 1 year after the date
3	of enactment of this Act, the Secretary, in cooperation with
4	appropriate State agencies, shall submit to the Committee
5	on Environment and Public Works of the Senate and the
6	Committee on Resources of the House of Representatives a
7	report providing—
8	(1) information relating to illegal trade in bear
9	viscera and products containing bear viscera within
10	the United States, and between the United States and
11	foreign countries;
12	(2) an assessment of whether any such trade is
13	affecting, or may affect, any bear populations in the
14	United States or in foreign countries;
15	(3) an assessment of State and Federal law en-
16	forcement efforts regarding any such trade;
17	(4) recommendations on additional legislation to
18	address interstate trade in illegally taken bear
19	viscera; and
20	(5) recommendations on additional actions to
21	protect native bears in foreign countries.
22	(b) Authorization of Appropriations.—There is
23	authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
24	\$400,000 for fiscal year 1999.

Amend the title so as to read: "A bill to prohibit the importation or exportation of, and foreign commerce in,

bear viscera and items, products, or substances containing bear viscera, and for other purposes.".
