IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

JULY 30, 1997

Mr. HELMS, from the Committee on Foreign Relations, reported the following
original concurrent resolution; which was placed on the calendar

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Senate regarding the terrorist
bombing in the Jerusalem market on July 30, 1997.

Whereas, on July 30, 1997, two terrorist bombs exploded al-
most simultaneously in an open-air Jerusalem market,
killing at least 18 people, and wounding more than 100;
and

Whereas this attack is a violent and vicious attack against
the peace process and against the people of Israel: Now,
therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring), That the Congress—*

1 (1) expresses the deep condolences of the Con-
2 gress and the American people to the people of Is-
3 rael for the loss of life and the serious injuries that
4 have been suffered in the terrorist bombing in the
5 Jerusalem market and expresses the solidarity of the
6 American people with the people of Israel in the
7 wake of this tragic and senseless act;

8 (2) expresses the determination of the Congress
9 to join with the Government of Israel in fighting
10 against terrorism;

11 (3) urges Yasser Arafat and officials of the Pal-
12 estinian Authority to do more to combat terrorism
13 and to eliminate terrorist networks in areas under
14 their control;

15 (4) calls on Yasser Arafat and officials of the
16 Palestinian Authority to cooperate more intensively
17 with the Israeli government in fighting terrorism;
18 and

19 (5) reaffirms the commitment of the United
20 States Congress to peace in the Middle East and
21 urges all parties to work to bring an end to terror-
22 ism to promote lasting peace and security in the re-
23 gion.
