Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Armed Services.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

JANUARY 30, 1997

Mr. THURMOND from the Committee on Armed Services, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Armed Services.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, and reporting such hear-
5 ings, and making investigations as authorized by para-
6 graphs 1 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of
7 the Senate, the Committee on Armed Services is author-
8 ized from March 1, 1997, through February 28, 1998, and
9 March 1, 1998, through February 28, 1999, in its discre-
10 tion: (1) To make expenditures from the contingent fund

1 of the Senate, (2) to employ personnel, and (3) with the
2 prior consent of the Government department or agency
3 concerned and the Committee on Rules and Administra-
4 tion, to use on a reimbursable or nonreimbursable basis
5 the services of personnel of any such department or
6 agency.

7 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
8 period March 1, 1997, through February 28, 1998, under
9 this resolution shall not exceed \$2,704,397.

10 (b) For the period March 1, 1998, through February
11 28, 1999, expenses of the committee under this resolution
12 shall not exceed \$2,776,389.

13 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
14 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
15 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
16 date, but not later than February 28, 1997, and February
17 28, 1998, respectively.

18 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
19 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
20 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
21 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required: (1) For

1 the disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an an-
2 nual rate, (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
3 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
4 keeper, United States Senate, (3) for the payment of sta-
5 tionery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the Sta-
6 tionery, United States Senate, (4) for payments to the
7 Postmaster, United States Senate, (5) for the payment of
8 metered charges on copying equipment provided by the Of-
9 fice of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper, United
10 States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate Recording
11 and Photographic Services.

12 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
13 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
14 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
15 1997, through February 28, 1998, and March 1, 1998,
16 through February 28, 1999, to be paid from the Appro-
17 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
18 tigation”.

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
