## **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

Expressing the sense of the Congress regarding Federal spending on veterans programs and allocation of funds received by the Federal Government for claims arising from smoking-related illnesses or an increased risk of smoking-related illnesses.

- Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate concurring), That it is the sense of the Congress that—

  (1) Federal spending on veterans programs for each of the next ten fiscal years should be increased by at least the rate of inflation;

  (2) at least 20 percent of any funds received by
