CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF EVENT TO CELEBRATE**
2 **THE 200TH BIRTHDAY OF THE LIBRARY OF**
3 **CONGRESS.**

4 The Library of Congress (in this resolution referred
5 to as the “sponsor”) shall be permitted to sponsor a public
6 event, the 200th birthday celebration of the Library of
7 Congress (in this resolution referred to as the “event”),
8 on the Capitol Grounds on April 24, 2000, or on such
9 other date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives
10 and the Committee on Rules and Administration of the
11 Senate may jointly designate.

12 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

13 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event shall be free of admis-
14 sion charge to the public and arranged not to interfere
15 with the needs of Congress, under conditions to be pre-
16 scribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol
17 Police Board.

18 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
19 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
20 incident to all activities associated with the event.

21 **SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**

22 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
23 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the sponsor may
24 erect upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound amplifi-
25 cation devices, and other related structures and equipment
26 as may be required for the event.

1 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
2 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
3 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-
4 quired to carry out the event, except that no arrangements
5 may be made to limit access to any public road on the
6 Capitol Grounds.

7 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

8 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
9 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
10 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
11 cerning sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations
12 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
13 cable to the Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event.
