Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the 200th birthday celebration
of the Library of Congress.

Mr. FRANKS of New Jersey (for himself and Mr. HOYER) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the 200th
birthday celebration of the Library of Congress.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF EVENT TO CELEBRATE**
4 **THE 200TH BIRTHDAY OF THE LIBRARY OF**
5 **CONGRESS.**

6 The Library of Congress (in this resolution referred
7 to as the “sponsor”) shall be permitted to sponsor a public
8 event, the 200th birthday celebration of the Library of
9 Congress (in this resolution referred to as the “event”),
10 on the Capitol Grounds on April 24, 2000, or on such

1 other date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives
2 and the Committee on Rules and Administration of the
3 Senate may jointly designate.

4 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

5 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The event shall be free of admis-
6 sion charge to the public and arranged not to interfere
7 with the needs of Congress, under conditions to be pre-
8 scribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol
9 Police Board.

10 (b) **EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.**—The sponsor shall
11 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
12 incident to all activities associated with the event.

13 **SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**

14 (a) **STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.**—Subject to the
15 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the sponsor may
16 erect upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound amplifi-
17 cation devices, and other related structures and equipment
18 as may be required for the event.

19 (b) **ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.**—The Architect of
20 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
21 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-
22 quired to carry out the event, including arrangements to
23 limit access to First Street Southeast between Independ-
24 ence Avenue and East Capitol Street.

1 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

2 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
3 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
4 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
5 cerning sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations
6 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
7 cable to the Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event.
