CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the 200th birthday celebration of the Library of Congress.

1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate

2 concurring),

3 SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF EVENT TO CELEBRATE 4 THE 200TH BIRTHDAY OF THE LIBRARY OF 5 CONGRESS.

6 The Library of Congress (in this resolution referred 7 to as the "sponsor") shall be permitted to sponsor a public 8 event, the 200th birthday celebration of the Library of 9 Congress (in this resolution referred to as the "event"), 10 on the Capitol Grounds on April 24, 2000, or on such other date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives
 and the Committee on Rules and Administration of the
 Senate may jointly designate.

4 SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event shall be free of admis-6 sion charge to the public and arranged not to interfere 7 with the needs of Congress, under conditions to be pre-8 scribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol 9 Police Board.

(b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
incident to all activities associated with the event.

13 SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.

(a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the sponsor may
erect upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound amplification devices, and other related structures and equipment
as may be required for the event.

(b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
to make any such additional arrangements as may be required to carry out the event, including arrangements to
limit access to First Street Southeast between Independence Avenue and East Capitol Street.

1 SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.

The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforcement of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), concerning sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event.
