Providing for the acceptance of a statue of Chief Washakie, presented by the people of Wyoming, for placement in National Statuary Hall, and for other purposes.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- Whereas Chief Washakie was a recognized leader of the Eastern Shoshone Tribe;
- Whereas Chief Washakie contributed to the settlement of the west by allowing the Oregon and Mormon Trails to pass through Shoshone lands;
- Whereas Chief Washakie, with his foresight and wisdom, chose the path of peace for his people;

- Whereas Chief Washakie was a great leader who chose his alliances with other tribes and the United States Government thoughtfully; and
- Whereas in recognition of this alliance and long service to the United States Government, Chief Washakie was the only chief to be awarded a full military funeral: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate

 - 3 SECTION 1. ACCEPTANCE OF STATUE OF CHIEF WASHAKIE
- 4 FROM THE PEOPLE OF WYOMING FOR PLACE-
- 5 MENT IN NATIONAL STATUARY HALL.
- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The statue of Chief Washakie,
- 7 furnished by the people of Wyoming for placement in Na-
- 8 tional Statuary Hall in accordance with section 1814 of
- 9 the Revised Statutes of the United States (40 U.S.C.
- 10 187), is accepted in the name of the United States, and
- 11 the thanks of the Congress are tendered to the people of
- 12 Wyoming for providing this commemoration of one of Wy-
- 13 oming's most eminent personages.
- 14 (b) Presentation Ceremony.—The State of Wyo-
- 15 ming is authorized to use the rotunda of the Capitol on
- 16 September 7, 2000, at 11 o'clock ante meridian, for a
- 17 presentation ceremony for the statue. The Architect of the
- 18 Capitol and the Capitol Police Board shall take such ac-
- 19 tion as may be necessary with respect to physical prepara-
- 20 tions and security for the ceremony.

- 1 (c) DISPLAY IN ROTUNDA.—The statue shall be dis-
- 2 played in the rotunda of the Capitol for a period of not
- 3 more than 6 months, after which period the statue shall
- 4 be moved to its permanent location in National Statuary
- 5 Hall.
- 6 SEC. 2. TRANSMITTAL TO GOVERNOR OF WYOMING.
- 7 The Clerk of the House of Representatives shall
- 8 transmit a copy of this concurrent resolution to the Gov-
- 9 ernor of Wyoming.
