Mr. Campbell submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- Calling upon the Government of Turkey to withdraw its armed forces from the island of Cyprus and to negotiate for the reunification of the Republic of Cyprus.
- Whereas in 1974, Turkey sent armed forces to Cyprus and occupied over 36 percent of the island, creating the wide-spread displacement of Greek Cypriots from the northern part of the island;
- Whereas since 1974, efforts by the United States and the United Nations to resolve this dispute remain unsuccessful;
- Whereas the European Union has commenced accession negotiations with the Government of Cyprus and concluded, at its December 1999 Helsinki European Council meeting, that, while a political settlement of this dispute

would facilitate the accession of Cyprus to the European Union, it would not be a precondition for accession;

Whereas accession to the European Union would allow a united Cyprus to take full advantage of European Union membership; and

Whereas more than 30,000 Turkish armed forces remain stationed on the island of Cyprus: Now, therefore, be it
