8	ation implementing a Kosovo peace agreement.
9	SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION FOR DEPLOYMENT OF UNITED
10	STATES ARMED FORCES TO KOSOVO.
11	The President is authorized to deploy United States
12	Armed Forces personnel to Kosovo as part of a NATO
13	peacekeeping operation implementing a Kosovo peace
