CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Regarding the use of United States Armed Forces as part
of a NATO peacekeeping operation implementing a
Kosovo peace agreement.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This resolution may be cited as the “Peacekeeping
5 Operations in Kosovo Resolution”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 The Congress makes the following findings:

8 (1) The conflict in Kosovo has caused great
9 human suffering and, if permitted to continue, could
10 threaten the peace of Europe.

1 (2) The Government of Serbia and representa-
2 tives of the people of Kosovo may agree in Ram-
3 bouillet, France, to end the conflict in Kosovo.

4 (3) President Clinton has promised to deploy
5 approximately 4,000 United States Armed Forces
6 personnel to Kosovo as part of a North Atlantic
7 Treaty Organization (NATO) peacekeeping oper-
8 ation implementing a Kosovo peace agreement.

9 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION FOR DEPLOYMENT OF UNITED**
10 **STATES ARMED FORCES TO KOSOVO.**

11 The President is authorized to deploy United States
12 Armed Forces personnel to Kosovo as part of a NATO
13 peacekeeping operation implementing a Kosovo peace
14 agreement.
