## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Transportation Em-5 ployee Fair Taxation Act of 1999".

1	SEC. 2. EQUITABLE TREATMENT FOR INDIVIDUALS EM-
2	PLOYED ON VESSELS WITH RESPECT TO
3	STATE AND LOCAL INCOME TAXES.
4	Section 11108 of title 46, United States Code, is
5	amended—
6	(1) by inserting "(a)" before the first sentence;
7	and
8	(2) by adding at the end the following:
9	((b)(1) An individual described in paragraph (2)
10	shall not be subject to the income tax laws of a State or
11	political subdivision of a State with respect to employment
12	or work referred to in paragraph (2), other than the State
13	and political subdivision in which the individual resides.
14	((2) An individual referred to in paragraph $(1)$ is—
15	"(A) any individual engaged on a vessel to per-
16	form assigned duties in more than one State as a
17	pilot licensed under section 7101 of this title or li-
18	censed or authorized under the laws of a State; or
19	"(B) any individual who performs regularly as-
20	signed duties while engaged as a master, officer, or
21	crewman on a vessel operating on the navigable wa-
22	ters of more than one State.".
