Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. ELIMINATION OF THE MANDATE THAT STATES

REQUIRE PEOPLE TO PROVIDE THEIR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS ON APPLICATIONS

FOR RECREATIONAL LICENSES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 466(a)(13)(A) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 666(a)(13)(A)) is amended
by striking "recreational license,".
