3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Volunteer Firefighter

5 and Rescue Squad Worker Protection Act".

6 SEC. 2. EXEMPTION.

Paragraph (4) of section 3(e) of the Fair Labor
8 Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. 203(e)) is amended by
9 adding after subparagraph (B) the following:

"(C) The term 'employee' does not include a fire-1 2 fighter or a member of a rescue squad during the period— 3 "(1) in which the firefighter or rescue squad 4 member volunteers the firefighter's or member's 5 services at a facility where the firefighter or member 6 is not then regularly employed; and 7 "(2) for which the firefighter or member signed a legally binding waiver of overtime compensation 8

9 for such services.".

10 SEC. 3. COERCION.

Section 7 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938
(29 U.S.C. 207) is amended by adding at the end the following:

14 "(r) No employer may require (directly or indirectly)
15 an employee who is a firefighter or member of a rescue
16 squad to volunteer fire-fighting or rescue squad services
17 during any period in which such firefighter or member
18 would be entitled to receive compensation for overtime em19 ployment under subsection (a) if section 3(e)(4)(C) was
20 not in effect.".
