3 (a) IN GENERAL.—In cooperation with other Federal agencies, the Secretary of the Army is authorized to de-4 5 velop and implement projects for fish screens, fish passage devices, and other similar measures agreed to by non-Fed-6 7 eral interests and relevant Federal agencies to mitigate 8 adverse impacts associated with irrigation system water 9 diversions by local governmental entities in the States of Oregon, Washington, Montana, and Idaho. 10

11 (b) PROCEDURE AND PARTICIPATION.—

(1) CONSULTATION REQUIREMENT; USE OF EX13 ISTING DATA.—In providing assistance under sub14 section (a), the Secretary shall consult with other
15 Federal, State, and local agencies and make max16 imum use of data and studies in existence on the
17 date of enactment of this Act.

18 (2) PARTICIPATION BY NON-FEDERAL INTER-19 ESTS.—Participation by non-Federal interests in 20 projects under this section shall be voluntary. The 21 Secretary shall not take any action under this sec-22 tion that will result in a non-Federal interest being 23 held financially responsible for an action under a 24 project unless the non-Federal interest has volun-25 tarily agreed to participate in the project.

(c) COST SHARING.—Projects carried out under this
 section on lands owned by the United States shall be car ried out at full Federal expense. The non-Federal share
 of the cost of any such project undertaken on lands not
 in Federal ownership shall be 35 percent.

6 (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
7 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
8 \$25,000,000 for fiscal year 2000 and each fiscal year
9 thereafter.

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
