## In the Senate of the United States,

November 19, 1999.

Resolved, That the bill from the House of Representatives (H.R. 1451) entitled "An Act to establish the Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial Commission.", do pass with the following

## **AMENDMENT:**

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Abraham Lincoln Bicen-
- 3 tennial Commission Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 5 Congress makes the following findings:
- 6 (1) Abraham Lincoln, the 16th President, was
- 7 one of the Nation's most prominent leaders, dem-
- 8 onstrating true courage during the Civil War, one of
- 9 the greatest crises in the Nation's history.
- 10 (2) Born of humble roots in Hardin County,
- 11 Kentucky, on February 12, 1809, Abraham Lincoln

- 1 rose to the Presidency through a legacy of honesty, in-2 tegrity, intelligence, and commitment to the United 3 States.
  - (3) With the belief that all men were created equal, Abraham Lincoln led the effort to free all slaves in the United States.
  - (4) Abraham Lincoln had a generous heart, with malice toward none and with charity for all.
  - (5) Abraham Lincoln gave the ultimate sacrifice for the country Lincoln loved, dying from an assassin's bullet on April 15, 1865.
  - (6) All Americans could benefit from studying the life of Abraham Lincoln, for Lincoln's life is a model for accomplishing the "American Dream" through honesty, integrity, loyalty, and a lifetime of education.
  - (7) The year 2009 will be the bicentennial anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln, and a commission should be established to study and recommend to Congress activities that are fitting and proper to celebrate that anniversary in a manner that appropriately honors Abraham Lincoln.

## 1 SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT.

2	There is established a commission to be known as the
3	Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial Commission (referred to in
4	this Act as the "Commission").
5	SEC. 4. DUTIES.
6	The Commission shall have the following duties:
7	(1) To study activities that may be carried out
8	by the Federal Government to determine whether the
9	activities are fitting and proper to honor Abraham
10	Lincoln on the occasion of the bicentennial anniver-
11	sary of Lincoln's birth, including—
12	(A) the minting of an Abraham Lincoln bi-
13	$centennial\ penny;$
14	(B) the issuance of an Abraham Lincoln bi-
15	$centennial\ postage\ stamp;$
16	(C) the convening of a joint meeting or joint
17	session of Congress for ceremonies and activities
18	relating to Abraham Lincoln;
19	(D) a redesignation of the Lincoln Memo-
20	rial, or other activity with respect to the Memo-
21	rial; and
22	(E) the acquisition and preservation of arti-
23	facts associated with Abraham Lincoln.
24	(2) To recommend to Congress the activities that
25	the Commission considers most fitting and proper to
26	honor Abraham Lincoln on such occasion, and the en-

1	tity or entities in the Federal Government that the
2	Commission considers most appropriate to carry out
3	such activities.
4	SEC. 5. MEMBERSHIP.
5	(a) Number and Appointment.—The Commission
6	shall be composed of 15 members appointed as follows:
7	(1) Two members, each of whom shall be a quali-
8	fied citizen described in subsection (b), appointed by
9	the President.
10	(2) One member, who shall be a qualified citizen
11	described in subsection (b), appointed by the Presi-
12	dent on the recommendation of the Governor of Illi-
13	nois.
14	(3) One member, who shall be a qualified citizen
15	described in subsection (b), appointed by the Presi-
16	dent on the recommendation of the Governor of Indi-
17	ana.
18	(4) One member, who shall be a qualified citizen
19	described in subsection (b), appointed by the Presi-
20	dent on the recommendation of the Governor of Ken-
21	tucky.
22	(5) Three members, at least one of whom shall be
23	a Member of the House of Representatives, appointed
24	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

1	(6) Three members, at least one of whom shall be
2	a Senator, appointed by the majority leader of the
3	Senate.
4	(7) Two members, at least one of whom shall be
5	a Member of the House of Representatives, appointed
6	by the minority leader of the House of Representa-
7	tives.
8	(8) Two members, at least one of whom shall be
9	a Senator, appointed by the minority leader of the
10	Senate.
11	(b) Qualified Citizen Citizen described
12	in this subsection is a private citizen of the United States
13	with—
14	(1) a demonstrated dedication to educating oth-
15	ers about the importance of historical figures and
16	events; and
17	(2) substantial knowledge and appreciation of
18	$Abraham\ Lincoln.$
19	(c) Time of Appointment.—Each initial appoint-
20	ment of a member of the Commission shall be made before
21	the expiration of the 120-day period beginning on the date
22	of enactment of this Act.
23	(d) Continuation of Membership.—If a member of
24	the Commission was appointed to the Commission as a
25	Member of Congress, and ceases to be a Member of Congress,

- 1 that member may continue to serve on the Commission for
- 2 not longer than the 30-day period beginning on the date
- 3 that member ceases to be a Member of Congress.
- 4 (e) TERMS.—Each member shall be appointed for the
- 5 life of the Commission.
- 6 (f) Vacancies.—A vacancy in the Commission shall
- 7 not affect the powers of the Commission but shall be filled
- 8 in the manner in which the original appointment was
- 9 made.
- 10 (g) Basic Pay.—Members shall serve on the Commis-
- 11 sion without pay.
- 12 (h) Travel Expenses.—Each member shall receive
- 13 travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence,
- 14 in accordance with sections 5702 and 5703 of title 5, United
- 15 States Code.
- 16 (i) Quorum.—Five members of the Commission shall
- 17 constitute a quorum but a lesser number may hold hearings.
- 18 (j) Chair.—The Commission shall select a Chair from
- 19 among the members of the Commission.
- 20 (k) Meetings.—The Commission shall meet at the call
- 21 of the Chair. Periodically, the Commission shall hold a
- 22 meeting in Springfield, Illinois.

#### 1 SEC. 6. DIRECTOR AND STAFF.

- 2 (a) Director.—The Commission may appoint and
- 3 fix the pay of a Director and such additional personnel as
- 4 the Commission considers to be appropriate.
- 5 (b) Applicability of Certain Civil Service
- 6 *LAWS.*—
- 7 (1) Director.—The Director of the Commission
- 8 may be appointed without regard to the provisions of
- 9 title 5, United States Code, governing appointments
- in the competitive service, and may be paid without
- 11 regard to the provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter
- 12 III of chapter 53 of that title relating to classification
- and General Schedule pay rates.
- 14 (2) STAFF.—The staff of the Commission shall be
- 15 appointed subject to the provisions of title 5, United
- 16 States Code, governing appointments in the competi-
- 17 tive service, and shall be paid in accordance with the
- provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III of chap-
- 19 ter 53 of that title relating to classification and Gen-
- 20 eral Schedule pay rates.
- 21 **SEC. 7. POWERS.**
- 22 (a) Hearings and Sessions.—The Commission may,
- 23 for the purpose of carrying out this Act, hold such hearings,
- 24 sit and act at such times and places, take such testimony,
- 25 and receive such evidence as the Commission considers to
- 26 be appropriate.

- 1 (b) Powers of Members and Agents.—Any mem-
- 2 ber or agent of the Commission may, if authorized by the
- 3 Commission, take any action that the Commission is au-
- 4 thorized to take by this Act.
- 5 (c) Obtaining Official Data.—The Commission
- 6 may secure directly from any department or agency of the
- 7 United States information necessary to enable the Commis-
- 8 sion to carry out this Act. Upon request of the Chair of
- 9 the Commission, the head of that department or agency
- 10 shall furnish that information to the Commission.
- 11 (d) Mails.—The Commission may use the United
- 12 States mails in the same manner and under the same condi-
- 13 tions as other departments and agencies of the United
- 14 States.
- 15 (e) Administrative Support Services.—Upon the
- 16 request of the Commission, the Administrator of General
- 17 Services shall provide to the Commission, on a reimbursable
- 18 basis, the administrative support services necessary for the
- 19 Commission to carry out its responsibilities under this Act.
- 20 SEC. 8. REPORTS.
- 21 (a) Interim Reports.—The Commission may submit
- 22 to Congress such interim reports as the Commission con-
- 23 siders to be appropriate.
- 24 (b) Final Report.—The Commission shall submit a
- 25 final report to Congress not later than the expiration of the

4-year period beginning on the date of the formation of the Commission. The final report shall contain— 3 (1) a detailed statement of the findings and conclusions of the Commission; (2) the recommendations of the Commission; and 5 6 (3) any other information that the Commission 7 considers to be appropriate. 8 SEC. 9. BUDGET ACT COMPLIANCE. 9 Any spending authority provided under this Act shall 10 be effective only to such extent and in such amounts as are provided in appropriation Acts. SEC. 10. TERMINATION. The Commission shall terminate 120 days after sub-13 mitting the final report of the Commission pursuant to sec-14 tion 8. 15 SEC. 11. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS. 17 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as 18 may be necessary to carry out this Act.
