AN ACT

To establish the Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial Commission.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Abraham Lincoln Bi-3 centennial Commission Act".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 The Congress makes the following findings:

6 (1) Abraham Lincoln, the 16th President, was
7 one of the Nation's most prominent leaders, dem8 onstrating true courage during the Civil War, one of
9 the greatest crises in the Nation's history.

10 (2) Born of humble roots in Hardin County,
11 Kentucky, on February 12, 1809, Abraham Lincoln
12 rose to the Presidency through a legacy of honesty,
13 integrity, intelligence, and commitment to the
14 United States.

(3) With the belief that all men were created
equal, Abraham Lincoln led the effort to free all
slaves in the United States.

18 (4) Abraham Lincoln had a generous heart,19 with malice toward none and with charity for all.

20 (5) Abraham Lincoln gave the ultimate sacrifice
21 for the country he loved, dying from an assassin's
22 bullet on April 15, 1865.

(6) All Americans could benefit from studying
the life of Abraham Lincoln, for his life is a model
for accomplishing the "American Dream" through

honesty, integrity, loyalty, and a lifetime of edu cation.

3 (7) The Year 2009 will be the bicentennial an4 niversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln, and a
5 commission should be established to study and rec6 ommend to the Congress activities that are fitting
7 and proper to celebrate that anniversary in a manner that appropriately honors Abraham Lincoln.

9 SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT.

There is established a commission to be known as the
Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial Commission (in this Act
referred to as the "Commission").

13 **SEC. 4. DUTIES.**

14 The Commission shall have the following duties:

(1) To study activities that may be carried out
by the Federal Government to determine whether
they are fitting and proper to honor Abraham Lincoln on the occasion of the bicentennial anniversary
of his birth, including—

- 20 (A) the minting of an Abraham Lincoln bi-21 centennial penny;
- (B) the issuance of an Abraham Lincolnbicentennial postage stamp;

1	(C) the convening of a joint meeting or
2	joint session of the Congress for ceremonies and
3	activities relating to Abraham Lincoln;
4	(D) a redesignation of the Lincoln Memo-
5	rial, or other activity with respect to the Memo-
6	rial; and
7	(E) the acquisition and preservation of ar-
8	tifacts associated with Abraham Lincoln.
9	(2) To recommend to the Congress the activi-
10	ties that the Commission considers most fitting and
11	proper to honor Abraham Lincoln on such occasion,
12	and the entity or entities in the Federal Government
13	that the Commission considers most appropriate to
14	carry out such activities.
15	SEC. 5. MEMBERSHIP.
16	(a) Number and Appointment.—The Commission
17	shall be composed of 15 members appointed as follows:
18	(1) Three members, each of whom shall be a
19	qualified citizen described in subsection (b), ap-
20	pointed by the President.
21	(2) Two members, each of whom shall be a
22	qualified citizen described in subsection (b), ap-
23	pointed by the President on the recommendation of
24	the Governor of Illinois.

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1	(3) Two members, each of whom shall be a
2	qualified citizen described in subsection (b), ap-
3	pointed by the President on the recommendation of
4	the Governor of Indiana.
5	(4) Two members, each of whom shall be a
6	qualified citizen described in subsection (b), ap-
7	pointed by the President on the recommendation of
8	the Governor of Kentucky.
9	(5) Two members, each of whom shall be Mem-
10	bers of the House of Representatives from the State
11	of Illinois, appointed by the Speaker of the House of
12	Representatives.
13	(6) One member, who shall be a Senator from
14	the State of Illinois, appointed by the Majority
15	Leader of the Senate.
16	(7) One member, who shall be a Senator, ap-
17	pointed by the Majority Leader of the Senate.
18	(8) One member, who shall be a Member of the
19	House of Representatives, appointed by the Minority
20	Leader of the House of Representatives.
21	(9) One member, who shall be a Senator, ap-
22	pointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate.
23	(b) QUALIFIED CITIZEN.—A qualified citizen de-
24	scribed in this subsection is a private citizen of the United
25	States with—

(1) a demonstrated dedication to educating oth ers about the importance of historical figures and
 events; and

4 (2) substantial knowledge and appreciation of5 Abraham Lincoln.

6 (c) TIME OF APPOINTMENT.—Each initial appoint7 ment of a member of the Commission shall be made before
8 the expiration of the 120-day period beginning on the date
9 of the enactment of this Act.

(d) CONTINUATION OF MEMBERSHIP.—If a member
was appointed to the Commission as a Member of Congress and the member ceases to be a Member of Congress,
that member may continue as a member for not longer
than the 30-day period beginning on the date that member
ceases to be a Member of Congress.

16 (e) TERMS.—Each member shall be appointed for the17 life of the Commission.

(f) VACANCIES.—A vacancy in the Commission shall
be filled in the manner in which the original appointment
was made.

(g) BASIC PAY.—Members shall serve without pay.
(h) TRAVEL EXPENSES.—Each member shall receive
travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence,
in accordance with sections 5702 and 5703 of title 5,
United States Code.

(i) QUORUM.—Five members of the Commission shall
 constitute a quorum but a lesser number may hold hear ings.

4 (j) CHAIRPERSON.—The Chairperson shall be des5 ignated by the President from among the members of the
6 Commission appointed under section 5(a)(1). The term of
7 office of the Chairperson shall be for the life of the Com8 mission.

9 (k) MEETINGS.—The Commission shall meet at the
10 call of the Chairperson. Periodically, the Commission shall
11 hold its meeting in Springfield, Illinois.

12 SEC. 6. DIRECTOR AND STAFF.

(a) DIRECTOR.—The Commission may appoint and
fix the pay of a Director and any additional personnel as
the Commission considers appropriate.

16 (b) APPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN CIVIL SERVICE17 Laws.—

(1) DIRECTOR.—The Director of the Commission may be appointed without regard to the provisions of title 5, United States Code, governing appointments in the competitive service, and may be
paid without regard to the provisions of chapter 51
and subchapter III of chapter 53 of that title relating to classification and General Schedule pay rates.

(2) STAFF.—The staff of the Commission shall
 be appointed subject to the provisions of title 5,
 United States Code, governing appointments in the
 competitive service, and shall be paid in accordance
 with the provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III
 of chapter 53 of that title relating to classification
 and General Schedule pay rates.

8 SEC. 7. POWERS.

9 (a) HEARINGS AND SESSIONS.—The Commission
10 may, for the purpose of carrying out this Act, hold hear11 ings, sit and act at times and places, take testimony, and
12 receive evidence as the Commission considers appropriate.
13 (b) POWERS OF MEMBERS AND AGENTS.—Any mem14 ber or agent of the Commission may, if authorized by the
15 Commission, take any action which the Commission is au-

16 thorized to take by this section.

(c) OBTAINING OFFICIAL DATA.—The Commission
may secure directly from any department or agency of the
United States information necessary to enable it to carry
out this Act. Upon request of the Chairperson of the Commission, the head of that department or agency shall furnish that information to the Commission.

23 (d) MAILS.—The Commission may use the United24 States mails in the same manner and under the same con-

ditions as other departments and agencies of the United
 States.

3 (e) ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT SERVICES.—Upon 4 the request of the Commission, the Administrator of Gen-5 eral Services shall provide to the Commission, on a reim-6 bursable basis, the administrative support services nec-7 essary for the Commission to carry out its responsibilities 8 under this Act.

9 SEC. 8. REPORTS.

(a) INTERIM REPORTS.—The Commission may submit to the Congress interim reports as the Commission
considers appropriate.

(b) FINAL REPORT.—The Commission shall transmit
a final report to the Congress not later than the expiration
of the 4-year period beginning on the date of the formation
of the Commission. The final report shall contain—

- 17 (1) a detailed statement of the findings and18 conclusions of the Commission;
- 19 (2) the recommendations of the Commission;20 and

21 (3) any other information the Commission con-22 siders appropriate.

23 SEC. 9. TERMINATION.

The Commission shall terminate 120 days after sub-mitting its final report pursuant to section 8.

1 SEC. 10. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

2 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums3 as may be necessary to carry out this Act.

4 SEC. 11. BUDGET ACT COMPLIANCE.

Any spending authority (as defined in subparagraphs
(A) and (C) of section 401(c)(2) of the Congressional
Budget Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 651(c)(2)(A) and (C)))
under this Act shall be effective only to such extent and
in such amounts as are provided in appropriation Acts. Passed the House of Representatives October 4, 1999.
