4	SECTION 1. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE DECLARATION

7	Section 2 of the Act of June 8, 1906 (34 Stat. 225,				
8	16 U.S.C. 431; popularly known as the Antiquities Act of

16	the public lands to be designated, the President shall—				
17	"(A) solicit public participation and comment in				
18	the development of a monument declaration; and				
19	"(B) consult with the Governor and congres-				
20	sional delegation of the State or territory in which				
21	such lands are located, to the extent practicable,				
22	least 60 days prior to any national monument dec				
23	laration.

25	the President shall consider any information made avail
