## A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act with respect to the women's business center program.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Women's Business Cen-
5	ters Sustainability Act of 1999".
6	SEC. 2. PRIVATE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS.
7	Section 29 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 656)
8	is amended—
9	(1) in subsection (a)—
10	(A) by redesignating paragraphs (2) and
11	(3) as paragraphs (3) and (4), respectively; and
12	(B) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-
13	lowing:
14	"(2) the term 'private nonprofit organization'
15	means an entity described in section 501(c) of the In-
16	ternal Revenue Code of 1986 that is exempt from tax-
17	ation under section 501(a) of such Code;"; and
18	(2) in subsection (b), by inserting "nonprofit"
19	after "private".

1	SEC. 3. INCREASED MANAGEMENT OVERSIGHT AND REVIEW
2	OF WOMEN'S BUSINESS CENTERS.
3	Section 29 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 656)
4	is amended—
5	(1) by striking subsection (h) and inserting the
6	following:
7	"(h) Program Examination.—
8	"(1) In General.—The Administration shall—
9	"(A) develop and implement procedures to
10	annually examine the programs and finances of
11	each women's business center established pursu-
12	ant to this section, pursuant to which each such
13	center shall provide to the Administration—
14	"(i) an itemized cost breakdown of ac-
15	tual expenditures for costs incurred during
16	the preceding year; and
17	"(ii) documentation regarding the
18	amount of matching assistance from non-
19	Federal sources obtained and expended by
20	the center during the preceding year in
21	order to meet the requirements of subsection
22	(c) and, with respect to any in-kind con-
23	tributions described in subsection $(c)(2)$ that
24	were used to satisfy the requirements of sub-
25	section (c), verification of the existence and
26	valuation of those contributions: and

1	"(B) analyze the results of each such exam-
2	ination and, based on that analysis, make a de-
3	termination regarding the viability of the pro-
4	grams and finances of each women's business
5	center.
6	"(2) Extension of contracts.—In deter-
7	mining whether to extend or renew a contract with a
8	women's business center, the Administration—
9	"(A) shall consider the results of the most
10	recent examination of the center under para-
11	graph (1); and
12	"(B) may withhold such extension or re-
13	newal, if the Administration determines that—
14	"(i) the center has failed to provide
15	any information required to be provided
16	under clause (i) or (ii) of paragraph (1)(A),
17	or the information provided by the center is
18	$in a dequate;\ or$
19	"(ii) the center has failed to provide
20	any information required to be provided by
21	the center for purposes of the report of the
22	Administration under subsection (j), or the
23	information provided by the center is inad-
24	equate."; and

1	(2) by striking subsection (j) and inserting the
2	following:
3	"(j) Management Report.—
4	"(1) In General.—The Administration shall
5	prepare and submit to the Committees on Small
6	Business of the House of Representatives and the Sen-
7	ate a report on the effectiveness of all projects con-
8	ducted under this section.
9	"(2) Contents.—Each report submitted under
10	paragraph (1) shall include information concerning,
11	with respect to each women's business center estab-
12	lished pursuant to this section—
13	"(A) the number of individuals receiving
14	assistance;
15	"(B) the number of startup business con-
16	$cerns\ formed;$
17	"(C) the gross receipts of assisted concerns;
18	"(D) the employment increases or decreases
19	of assisted concerns;
20	"(E) to the maximum extent practicable,
21	increases or decreases in profits of assisted con-
22	cerns;
23	"(F) documentation detailing the most re-
24	cent analysis undertaken under subsection
25	(h)(1)(B) and the determinations made by the

1	Administration with respect to that analysis;
2	and
3	"(G) demographic data regarding the staff
4	of the center.".
5	SEC. 4. WOMEN'S BUSINESS CENTER SUSTAINABILITY
6	PILOT PROGRAM.
7	(a) In General.—Section 29 of the Small Business
8	Act (15 U.S.C. 656) is amended by adding at the end the
9	following:
10	"(l) Sustainability Pilot Program.—
11	"(1) In general.—There is established a 4-year
12	pilot program under which the Administration is au-
13	thorized to make grants (referred to in this section as
14	'sustainability grants') on a competitive basis for an
15	additional 5-year project under this section to any
16	private nonprofit organization (or a division there-
17	of)—
18	"(A) that has received financial assistance
19	under this section pursuant to a grant, contract,
20	or cooperative agreement; and
21	"(B) that—
22	"(i) is in the final year of a 5-year
23	project; or
24	"(ii) to the extent that amounts are
25	available for such purpose under subsection

1	(k)(4)(B), has completed a project financed
2	under this section (or any predecessor to
3	this section) and continues to provide as-
4	sistance to women entrepreneurs.
5	"(2) Conditions for participation.—In order
6	to receive a sustainability grant, an organization de-
7	scribed in paragraph (1) shall submit to the Adminis-
8	tration an application, which shall include—
9	"(A) a certification that the applicant—
10	"(i) is a private nonprofit organiza-
11	tion;
12	"(ii) employs a full-time executive di-
13	rector or program manager to manage the
14	women's business center for which a grant
15	is sought; and
16	"(iii) as a condition of receiving a sus-
17	tainability grant, agrees—
18	"(I) to an annual examination by
19	the Administration of the center's pro-
20	grams and finances; and
21	"(II) to the maximum extent
22	practicable, to remedy any problems
23	identified pursuant to that examina-
24	tion;

1	"(B) information demonstrating that the
2	applicant has the ability and resources to meet
3	the needs of the market to be served by the wom-
4	en's business center site for which a sustain-
5	ability grant is sought, including the ability to
6	raise financial resources;
7	"(C) information relating to assistance pro-
8	vided by the women's business center site for
9	which a sustainability grant is sought in the
10	area in which the site is located, including—
11	"(i) the number of individuals assisted;
12	"(ii) the number of hours of counseling,
13	training, and workshops provided; and
14	"(iii) the number of startup business
15	$concerns\ formed;$
16	"(D) information demonstrating the effec-
17	tive experience of the applicant in—
18	"(i) conducting financial, manage-
19	ment, and marketing assistance programs,
20	as described in paragraphs (1), (2), and (3)
21	of subsection (b), designed to impart or up-
22	grade the business skills of women business
23	owners or potential owners;
24	"(ii) providing training and services
25	to a representative number of women who

1	are both socially and economically dis-
2	advantaged;
3	"(iii) using resource partners of the
4	Administration and other entities, such as
5	universities;
6	"(iv) complying with the cooperative
7	agreement of the applicant; and
8	"(v) prudently managing finances and
9	staffing, including the manner in which the
10	performance of the applicant compared to
11	the business plan of the applicant and the
12	manner in which grants made under sub-
13	section (b) were used by the applicant; and
14	"(E) a 5-year plan that demonstrates the
15	ability of the women's business center site for
16	which a sustainability grant is sought—
17	"(i) to serve women business owners or
18	potential owners in the future by improving
19	fundraising and training activities; and
20	"(ii) to provide training and services
21	to a representative number of women who
22	are both socially and economically dis-
23	advantaged.
24	"(3) Review of Applications.—

1	"(A) In General.—The Administration
2	shall—
3	"(i) review each application submitted
4	under paragraph (2) based on the informa-
5	tion provided under subparagraphs (D) and
6	(E) of that paragraph, and the criteria set
7	forth in subsection (f); and
8	"(ii) approve or disapprove applica-
9	tions for sustainability grants simulta-
10	neously with applications for grants under
11	subsection (b).
12	"(B) Data collection.—Consistent with
13	the annual report to Congress under subsection
14	(j), each women's business center site that re-
15	ceives a sustainability grant shall, to the max-
16	imum extent practicable, collect the information
17	relating to—
18	"(i) the number of individuals assisted;
19	"(ii) the number of hours of counseling
20	and training provided and workshops con-
21	ducted;
22	"(iii) the number of startup business
23	$concerns\ formed;$
24	"(iv) any available gross receipts of as-
25	sisted concerns; and

1	"(v) the number of jobs created, main-
2	tained, or lost at assisted concerns.
3	"(C) RECORD RETENTION.—The Adminis-
4	tration shall maintain a copy of each applica-
5	tion submitted under this subsection for not less
6	than 10 years.
7	"(4) Non-federal contribution.—
8	"(A) In General.—Notwithstanding any
9	other provision of this section, as a condition of
10	receiving a sustainability grant, an organization
11	described in paragraph (1) shall agree to obtain,
12	after its application has been approved under
13	paragraph (3) and notice of award has been
14	issued, cash and in-kind contributions from non-
15	Federal sources for each year of additional pro-
16	gram participation in an amount equal to 1
17	non-Federal dollar for each Federal dollar.
18	"(B) In-kind contributions.—Not more
19	than 50 percent of the non-Federal assistance ob-
20	tained for purposes of subparagraph (A) may be
21	in the form of in-kind contributions that exist
22	only as budget line items, including such con-
23	tributions of office equipment and office space.
24	"(5) Timing of requests for proposals.—In
25	carrying out this subsection, the Administration shall

1	issue requests for proposals for women's business cen-
2	ters applying for the pilot program under this sub-
3	section simultaneously with requests for proposals for
4	grants under subsection (b).".
5	(b) Authorization of Appropriations.—Section
6	29(k) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 656(k)) is
7	amended—
8	(1) by striking paragraph (1) and inserting the
9	following:
10	"(1) In general.—There is authorized to be ap-
11	propriated, to remain available until the expiration
12	of the pilot program under subsection (l)—
13	"(A) \$12,000,000 for fiscal year 2000;
14	"(B) \$12,800,000 for fiscal year 2001;
15	"(C) \$13,700,000 for fiscal year 2002; and
16	"(D) \$14,500,000 for fiscal year 2003.";
17	(2) in paragraph (2)—
18	(A) by striking "Amounts made" and in-
19	serting the following:
20	"(A) In general.—Except as provided in
21	subparagraph (B), amounts made"; and
22	(B) by adding at the end the following:
23	"(B) Exception.—Of the total amount
24	made available under this subsection for a fiscal
25	year, the following amounts shall be available for

1	costs incurred in connection with the selection of
2	applicants for assistance under this subsection
3	and with monitoring and oversight of the pro-
4	gram authorized under this subsection:
5	"(i) For fiscal year 2000, 2 percent of
6	such total amount.
7	"(ii) For fiscal year 2001, 1.9 percent
8	of such total amount.
9	"(iii) For fiscal year 2002, 1.9 percent
10	of such total amount.
11	"(iv) For fiscal year 2003, 1.6 percent
12	of such total amount."; and
13	(3) by adding at the end the following:
14	"(4) Reservation of funds for sustain-
15	ABILITY PILOT PROGRAM.—
16	"(A) In general.—Of the total amount
17	made available under this subsection for a fiscal
18	year, the following amounts shall be reserved for
19	$sustainability\ grants\ under\ subsection\ (l):$
20	"(i) For fiscal year 2000, 17 percent of
21	such total amount.
22	"(ii) For fiscal year 2001, 18.8 percent
23	of such total amount.
24	"(iii) For fiscal year 2002, 30.2 per-
25	cent of such total amount.

1	"(iv) For fiscal year 2003, 30.2 percent
2	of such total amount.
3	"(B) Use of unawarded reserve
4	FUNDS.—
5	"(i) Sustainability grants to
6	OTHER CENTERS.—Of amounts reserved
7	under subparagraph (A), the Administra-
8	tion shall use any funds that remain avail-
9	able after making grants in accordance with
10	subsection (l) to make grants under such
11	subsection to women's business center sites
12	that have completed a project financed
13	under this section (or any predecessor to
14	this section) and that continue to provide
15	assistance to women entrepreneurs.
16	"(ii) Additional Grants.—The Ad-
17	ministration shall use any funds described
18	in clause (i) that remain available after
19	making grants under such clause to make
20	grants to additional women's business cen-
21	ter sites, or to increase the grants to exist-
22	ing women's business center sites, under
23	subsection (b).".
24	(c) GUIDELINES.—Not later than 30 days after the
25	date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the

- 1 Small Business Administration shall issue guidelines to im-
- $2\ \ plement\ the\ amendments\ made\ by\ this\ section.$
- 3 SEC. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 4 This Act and the amendments made by this Act shall
- 5 take effect on October 1, 1999.
