A BILL

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 3 4 This Act may be cited as the "Forest Roads-Community Right-To-Know Act". 5 SEC. 2. FOREST SERVICE AND BUREAU OF LAND MANAGE-7 MENT PROCEDURES FOR PERMANENT CLO-8 SURE OF FOREST ROADS. 9 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section: 10 (1) Permanent closure.—The term "perma-11 nent closure", with respect to a forest road, means the 12 closure of the road to vehicular traffic for a contin-13 uous period of more than one year. The term includes 14 a road closure of one year or less, or of an unspecified 15 duration, unless the Secretary concerned certifies at

1	the time of the closure that the closure will not extend
2	beyond one year.
3	(2) Forest road.—The term "forest road"
4	means any road on Federal lands.
5	(3) FEDERAL LANDS.—The term "Federal lands"
6	means—
7	(A) lands administered by the Bureau of
8	Land Management; and
9	(B) lands within units of the National For-
10	est System.
11	(4) State and local government offi-
12	CIALS.—The term "State and local government offi-
13	cials" means elected officials of States and counties
14	within which Federal lands are located.
15	(5) Secretary concerned.—The term "Sec-
16	retary concerned" means—
17	(A) with respect to the Federal lands de-
18	scribed in paragraph (3)(A), the Secretary of the
19	Interior; and
20	(B) with respect to the Federal lands de-
21	scribed in paragraph $(3)(B)$, the Secretary of

23	(b) Advance Notice of Permanent Road Clo-
24	SURES TO STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS —

1	(1) Purpose.—The purpose of this subsection is
2	to ensure that the Secretary concerned involves State
3	and local government officials in the process by which
4	the Secretary concerned considers and plans for the
5	potential permanent closure of forest roads on Federa
6	lands.
7	(2) Annual meetings required.—At least
8	once each fiscal year, the Secretary concerned shall
9	meet with appropriate State and local government of
10	ficials to describe all agency plans or proposals that
11	within the next two fiscal years, will or may result
12	in the permanent closure of forest roads on Federa
13	lands. Such agency plans or proposals include projec
14	proposals, land management plan amendments or re
15	visions, resource management plan amendments or
16	revisions, and regional or subregional plans or pro-
17	posals
18	(3) Elements of notice.—At a meeting under
19	paragraph (2), the Secretary concerned shall provide
20	information, using maps and other means, that at a
21	minimum—
22	(A) shows forest roads selected or proposed

- (B) shows traffic patterns and volumes on

- 1 (C) explains how users of the roads will be 2 adversely affected with longer travel times or ad-3 verse travel conditions by the permanent closure 4 of the roads.
 - (4) Special rule for first meeting conducted under paragraph (2) for a State or local government, the Secretary concerned shall also provide information on all forest roads that have been subject to permanent closure in that State during the previous five years. The information shall include a map showing the location of the forest roads and a description of the methods and costs of the permanent closure of the forest roads.

(c) Public Notice and Comment Requirements.—

(1) Local Notice.—Before proceeding with the permanent closure of a forest road, the Secretary concerned shall publish an announcement describing the proposed closure in the local newspaper of record for the area likely to be affected by the permanent closure of the road. The announcement shall include a description and map of the forest road selected or proposed for permanent closure and a description of any comments generated regarding the closure in meetings with State and local government officials under subsection (b).

1 (2) Comment period.—The permanent closure 2 of a forest road may not take effect until after the end 3 of the 90-day period beginning on the date that the 4 announcement under paragraph (1) was published re-5 garding that road so as to permit the public to sub-6 mit comments regarding the decision to select or pro-7 pose the forest road for permanent closure. 8 (d) Prohibition on Permanent Road Closures.— The permanent closure of a forest road is prohibited 10 unless-11 (1) advance notice of the permanent closure of 12 the road is provided to the appropriate State and 13 local government officials in the manner provided in 14 subsection (b); and 15 (2) the Secretary complies with the public notice 16 and comment requirements under subsection (c). 17 (e) Application of Requirements.—The requirements of this section shall take effect on the date of the en-18 actment of this Act, except that the prohibition contained 19 in subsection (d)(1) shall not apply to prohibit the perma-21 nent closure of any forest road implemented during the fis-22 cal year in which this section is enacted. 23 (f) Effect on Valid and Existing Rights.—Noth-

ing in this section shall invalidate rights-of-way designated

under section 2477 of the Revised Statutes of 1878 (43

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- 1 U.S.C. 932) or other valid and existing rights, including
- 2 rights of ingress and egress.
- 3 (g) Compliance With State Laws.—In carrying
- 4 out this section with respect to a forest road, the Secretary
- 5 concerned shall comply with the applicable laws of the State
- 6 in which the forest road is located.

7 SEC. 3. EMERGENCIES.

- 8 (a) Emergency Road Closures.—Subject to sub-
- 9 section (b), the requirements of section 2 shall not apply
- 10 to emergency road closures where life or property would be
- 11 endangered or threatened in the absence of the road closure.
- 12 (b) Length of Closure.—If an emergency road clo-
- 13 sure will extend beyond one year, the Secretary concerned
- 14 shall comply with the requirements of section 2 within three
- 15 months after the date on which the emergency road closure
- 16 commenced.

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
