- To amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to extend the designation of a portion of the Lamprey River in New Hampshire as a recreational river to include an additional river segment.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Lamprey Wild and3 Scenic River Extension Act".

4 SEC. 2. LAMPREY RECREATIONAL RIVER, NEW HAMPSHIRE.

5 (a) ADDITIONAL SEGMENT.—The paragraph entitled
6 "LAMPREY RIVER, NEW HAMPSHIRE" in section 3(a) of
7 the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C. 1274(a)) is
8 amended—

9 (1) by striking "11.5-mile segment extending
10 from the southern Lee town line" and inserting
11 "23.5-mile segment extending from the Bunker
12 Pond Dam in Epping"; and

13 (2) by striking "towns of" and inserting "towns14 of Epping,".

(b) MANAGEMENT.—Section 405 of division I of the
Omnibus Parks and Public Lands Management Act of
17 1996 (Public Law 104–333; 110 Stat. 4149; 16 U.S.C.
18 1274 note) is amended—

19 (1) in subsection (b)(2), by inserting "Epping,"20 before "Durham"; and

21 (2) by striking subsection (c).
