A BILL

To clarify the categories of children eligible for enrollment at the Library of Congress day care center.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. CATEGORIES OF CHILDREN ELIGIBLE FOR EN-
4	ROLLMENT AT LIBRARY OF CONGRESS DAY
5	CARE CENTER.
6	(a) In General.—Paragraph (1) of section 205(g)
7	of the Legislative Branch Appropriations Act, 1991 (2
8	U.S.C. 141 note) is amended to read as follows:
9	"(1) as a day care center providing child care
10	services to a group of children of whom at least 50

1	percent have 1 parent or guardian who is a Federal
2	employee, in accordance with the priorities for en-
3	rollment described in subsection (i);".
4	(b) Priorities for Enrollment.—Section 205 of
5	such Act (2 U.S.C. 141 note) is amended by adding at
6	the end the following new subsection:
7	"(i) The priorities for enrollment of children in the
8	day care center of the Library of Congress are as follows:
9	"(1) The first priority for enrollment shall be
10	given to children or grandchildren of Library of Con-
11	gress employees and dependent children who live
12	with such employees.
13	"(2) The second priority for enrollment shall be
14	given to children of other legislative branch employ-
15	ees and dependent children who live with such em-
16	ployees.
17	"(3) The third priority for enrollment shall be
18	given to children of employees of other Federal de-
19	partments and agencies and dependent children who
20	live with such employees.
21	"(4) Final priority shall be given to children of
