## **AN ACT**

To amend title 18, United States Code, to punish the depiction of animal cruelty.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1SECTION 1. PUNISHMENT FOR DEPICTION OF ANIMAL2CRUELTY.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 3 of title 18, United
4 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol5 lowing:

## 6 "§ 48. Depiction of animal cruelty

7 "(a) CREATION, SALE, OR POSSESSION.—Whoever 8 knowingly creates, sells, or possesses a depiction of animal 9 cruelty with the intention of placing that depiction in 10 interstate or foreign commerce for commercial gain, shall 11 be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than 5 12 years, or both.

13 "(b) EXCEPTION.—Subsection (a) does not apply to
14 any depiction that has serious religious, political, sci15 entific, educational, journalistic, historical, or artistic
16 value.

17 "(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

18 "(1) the term 'depiction of animal cruelty' 19 means any visual or auditory depiction, including 20 any photograph, motion-picture film, video record-21 ing, electronic image, or sound recording of conduct 22 in which a living animal is intentionally maimed, 23 mutilated, tortured, wounded, or killed, if such con-24 duct is illegal under Federal law or the law of the State in which the creation, sale, or possession takes 25 26 place, regardless of whether the maining, mutilation, torture, wounding, or killing took place in the
 State; and

3 "(2) the term 'State' means each of the several
4 States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth
5 of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, American
6 Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
7 Islands, and any other commonwealth, territory, or
8 possession of the United States.".

9 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
10 for such chapter is amended by adding at the end the fol11 lowing:

"48. Depiction of animal cruelty.".
