A BILL

To allow postal patrons to contribute to funding for emergency food relief within the United States through the voluntary purchase of certain specially issued United States postage stamps.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "George Thomas Mick-
- 5 ey' Leland Hunger Relief Stamp Act of 1999".

1	SEC. 2. SPECIAL POSTAGE STAMPS FOR EMERGENCY FOOD
2	RELIEF WITHIN THE UNITED STATES.
3	(a) In General.—Chapter 4 of title 39, United
4	States Code, is amended by inserting after section 414 the
5	following:
6	"§ 414a. Special postage stamps for emergency food
7	relief within the United States
8	"(a) In order to afford the public a convenient way
9	to contribute to emergency food relief within the United
10	States, the Postal Service shall establish a special rate of
11	postage for first-class mail under this section.
12	"(b) The rate of postage established under this
13	section—
14	((1) shall be equal to the regular first-class rate
15	of postage, plus a differential of not to exceed 25
16	percent;
17	"(2) shall be set by the Governors in accord-
18	ance with such procedures as the Governors shall by
19	regulation prescribe (in lieu of the procedures under
20	chapter 36); and
21	"(3) shall be offered as an alternative to the
22	regular first-class rate of postage.
23	The use of the special rate of postage established under
24	this section shall be voluntary on the part of postal pa-
25	trons.

1	"(c)(1) Of the amounts becoming available for emer-
2	gency food relief within the United States pursuant to this
3	section, the Postal Service shall pay—
4	"(A) 50 percent to the Department of Agri-
5	culture, for purposes of the Emergency Food Assist-
6	ance Program; and
7	"(B) 50 percent to the Agency for International
8	Development, for purposes of the Africa Food Secu-
9	rity Initiative.
10	Payments under this paragraph to an agency shall be
11	made under such arrangements as the Postal Service shall
12	by mutual agreement with such agency establish in order
13	to carry out the purposes of this section, except that,
14	under those arrangements, payments to that agency shall
15	be made at least twice a year.
16	"(2) For purposes of this section, the term 'amounts
17	becoming available for emergency food relief within the
18	United States pursuant to this section' means—
19	"(A) the total amounts received by the Postal
20	Service that it would not have received but for the
21	enactment of this section, reduced by
22	"(B) an amount sufficient to cover reasonable
23	costs incurred by the Postal Service in carrying out
24	this section, including those attributable to the

- 1 printing, sale, and distribution of stamps under this
- 2 section,
- 3 as determined by the Postal Service under regulations that
- 4 it shall prescribe.
- 5 "(d) It is the sense of the Congress that nothing in
- 6 this section should—
- 7 "(1) directly or indirectly cause a net decrease
- 8 in total funds received by the Department of Agri-
- 9 culture, the Agency for International Development,
- or any other agency of the Government (or any com-
- ponent or program thereof) below the level that
- would otherwise have been received but for the en-
- actment of this section; or
- 14 "(2) affect regular first-class rates of postage
- or any other regular rates of postage.
- 16 "(e) Special postage stamps under this section shall
- 17 be made available to the public beginning on such date
- 18 as the Postal Service shall by regulation prescribe, but in
- 19 no event later than 12 months after the date of the enact-
- 20 ment of this section.
- 21 "(f) The Postmaster General shall include in each re-
- 22 port rendered under section 2402 with respect to any pe-
- 23 riod during any portion of which this section is in effect
- 24 information concerning the operation of this section, ex-
- 25 cept that, at a minimum, each shall include—

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1	"(1) the total amount described in subsection
2	(c)(2)(A) which was received by the Postal Service
3	during the period covered by such report; and
4	"(2) of the amount under paragraph (1), how
5	much (in the aggregate and by category) was re-
6	quired for the purposes described in subsection
7	(c)(2)(B).
8	"(g) This section shall cease to be effective at the
9	end of the 2-year period beginning on the date on which
10	special postage stamps under this section are first made
11	available to the public.".
12	(b) Conforming Amendments.—(1) The analysis
13	for chapter 4 of title 39, United States Code, is amended
14	by striking the item relating to section 414 and inserting
15	the following:
	"414. Special postage stamps for breast cancer research. "414a. Special postage stamps for emergency food relief within the United States.".

- 16 (2) The heading for section 414 of title 39, United
- States Code, is amended to read as follows:
- "§ 414. Special postage stamps for breast cancer re-
- 19 search.".

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
