A BILL

To record place of birth as Jerusalem, Israel, for purposes of United States passports.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Jerusalem Birthplace
5 Act of 1999”.

1 **SEC. 2. RECORD OF PLACE OF BIRTH AS JERUSALEM,**
2 **ISRAEL.**

3 For purposes of the registration of birth, certification
4 of nationality, or issuance of a passport of a United States
5 citizen born in the city of Jerusalem, the Secretary of
6 State shall record the place of birth as Jerusalem, Israel.
