A BILL

To promote preservation and public awareness of the history of the Underground Railroad by providing financial assistance, to the Freedom Center in Cincinnati, Ohio. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 This Act may be cited as the "National Underground

5 Railroad Freedom Center Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.

7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

8 (1) the National Underground Railroad Freedom
9 Center (hereinafter "Freedom Center") is a nonprofit
10 organization incorporated under the laws of the State
11 of Ohio in 1995;

12 (2) the objectives of the Freedom Center are to 13 interpret the history of the Underground Railroad 14 through development of a national cultural institu-15 tion in Cincinnati, Ohio, that will house an interpre-16 tive center, including museum, educational, and re-17 search facilities, all dedicated to communicating to 18 the public the importance of the quest for human free-19 dom which provided the foundation for the historic 20 and inspiring story of the Underground Railroad;

21 (3) the city of Cincinnati has granted exclusive
22 development rights for a prime riverfront location to
23 the Freedom Center;

24 (4) the Freedom Center will be a national center
25 linked through state-of-the-art technology to Under-

| 12 | (b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are— |
| 13 | (1) to promote preservation and public aware- |
| 14 | ness of the history of the Underground Railroad; |
| 15 | (2) to assist the Freedom Center in the develop- |
| 16 | ment of its programs and facilities in Cincinnati, |
| 17 | Ohio; and |
| 18 | (3) to assist the National Park Service in the |
| 19 | implementation of the National Underground Rail- |
| 20 | road Network to Freedom Act (16 U.S.C. 469l). |
| 21 | SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS. |
| 22 | In this Act: |
| 23 | (1) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means |
| 24 | the Secretary of the Interior. |

| 19 | Government, and shall not be less than 80 percent of |

3 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

4 (a) PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.—From sums appro5 priated pursuant to the authority of subsection (d) in any
6 fiscal year, the Secretary is authorized and directed to pro7 vide financial assistance to the Freedom Center, in order
8 to pay the Federal share of the cost of authorized activities
9 described in section 5.

10 (b) EXPENDITURE ON NON-FEDERAL PROPERTY.—The Secretary is authorized to expend appropriated funds under 11 subsection (a) of this section to assist in the construction 12 13 of the Freedom Center facility and the development of programs and exhibits for that facility which will be funded 14 15 primarily through private and non-Federal funds, on property owned by the city of Cincinnati, Hamilton County, 16 17 and the State of Ohio.

(c) DESCRIPTION OF THE FREEDOM CENTER FACILITY
SITE.—The facility referred to in subsections (a) and (b)
will be located on a site described as follows: a 2-block area
south of new South Second, west of Walnut Street, north
of relocated Theodore M. Berry Way, and east of Vine Street
in Cincinnati, Ohio.

24 (d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There are
25 authorized to be appropriated \$16,000,000 for the 4 fiscal

year period beginning October 1, 1999. Funds not to exceed
 that total amount may be appropriated in 1 or more of
 such fiscal years. Funds shall not be disbursed until the
 Freedom Center has commitments for a minimum of 50
 percent of the non-Federal share.

6 (e) AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.—Notwithstanding any
7 other provision of law, funds appropriated to carry out the
8 provisions of this Act shall remain available for obligation
9 and expenditure until the end of the fiscal year succeeding
10 the fiscal year for which the funds were appropriated.

(f) OTHER PROVISIONS.—Any grant made under this
Act shall provide that—

(1) no change or alteration may be made in the
Freedom Center facility except with the agreement of
the property owner and the Secretary;

(2) the Secretary shall have the right of access at
reasonable times to the public portions of the Freedom
Center facility for interpretive and other purposes;
and

20 (3) conversion, use, or disposal of the Freedom
21 Center facility for purposes contrary to the purposes
22 of this Act, as determined by the Secretary, shall re23 sult in a right of the United States to compensation
24 equal to the greater of—

| 1 | (A) all Federal funds made available to the |

7 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Freedom Center may engage in any activity related to its objectives addressed in section 9 2(a), including, but not limited to, construction of the Free-10 dom Center facility, development of programs and exhibits 11 12 related to the history of the Underground Railroad, research, collection of information and artifacts and edu-13 14 cational activities related to the history of the Underground 15 Railroad, and any administrative activities necessary to the operation of the Freedom Center. 16

17 (b) PRIORITIES.—The Freedom Center shall give pri18 ority to—

(1) construction of the Freedom Center facility;
(2) development of programs and exhibits to be
presented in or from the Freedom Center facility; and
(3) providing assistance to the National Park
Service in the implementation of the National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom Act (16 U.S.C.
469l).

1 SEC. 6. APPLICATION.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Freedom Center shall submit
3 an application to the Secretary at such time, in such man4 ner, and containing or accompanied by such information
5 as the Secretary may reasonably require. Each application
6 shall—

7 (1) describe the activities for which assistance is
8 sought;

9 (2)provide assurances that the non-Federal 10 share of the cost of activities of the Freedom Center 11 shall be paid from non-Federal sources, together with 12 an accounting of costs expended by the Freedom Cen-13 ter to date, a budget of costs to be incurred prior to 14 the opening of the Freedom Center facility, an ac-15 counting of funds raised to date, both Federal and 16 non-Federal, and a projection of funds to be raised 17 through the completion of the Freedom Center facility. 18 (b) APPROVAL.—The Secretary shall approve the ap-19 plication submitted pursuant to subsection (a) unless such 20 application fails to comply with the provisions of this Act. 21 SEC. 7. REPORTS.

22 The Freedom Center shall submit an annual report to 23 the appropriate committees of the Congress not later than 24 January 31, 2000, and each succeeding year thereafter for 25 any fiscal year in which Federal funds are expended pursu-26 ant to this Act. The report shall—

| 10 | SEC. 8. AMENDMENT TO THE NATIONAL UNDERGROUND |
| 11 | RAILROAD NETWORK TO FREEDOM ACT OF |
| 12 | 1998. |
| 13 | The National Underground Railroad Network to Free- |
| 14 | dom Act of 1998 (Public Law 105–203) is amended by add- |
| 15 | ing at the end the following: |
| 16 | "SEC. 4. PRESERVATION OF HISTORIC SITES OR STRUC- |
| 17 | TURES. |
| 18 | "(a) AUTHORITY TO MAKE GRANTS.—The Secretary |
| 19 | of the Interior may make grants, in accordance with this |
| 20 | section, to historic sites or structures associated with the |
| 21 | Underground Railroad for the preservation and restoration |
| 22 | of buildings or structures listed on, or eligible for listing |
| 23 | on, the National Register of Historic Places. |
| 24 | "(b) GRANT CONDITIONS.—Any grant made under this |
| 25 | section shall provide that— |

| 1 | "(1) no change or alteration may be made in |

| 2 | property for which the grant is used except with the |
| 3 | agreement of the property owner and the Secretary; |
| 4 | "(2) the Secretary shall have the right of access |
| 5 | at reasonable times to the public portions of such |

| 7 | "(3) conversion, use, or disposal of such property |
| 8 | for purposes contrary to the purposes of this Act, as |
| 9 | determined by the Secretary, shall result in a right of |

| 13 | "(c) Matching Requirement.—The Secretary may |
| 14 | obligate funds made available for a grant under this section |
| 15 | only if the grantee agrees to match, from funds derived from |

16 non-Federal sources, the amount of the grant with an
17 amount that is equal to or greater than the grant. The Sec18 retary may waive the requirement of the preceding sentence
19 with respect to a grant if the Secretary determines that an
20 extreme emergency exists or that such a waiver is in the
21 public interest to assure the preservation of historically sig22 nificant resources.

23 "(d) FUNDING.—There are authorized to be appro24 priated to the Secretary for purposes of this section
25 \$2,500,000 for fiscal year 2001 and each subsequent fiscal

- 1 year. Amounts authorized but not appropriated in a fiscal
- 2 year shall be available for appropriation in subsequent fis-
- 3 cal years.".

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
