## A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to extend for an additional 2 years the period for admission of an alien as a nonimmigrant under section 101(a)(15)(S) of such Act, and to authorize appropriations for the refugee assistance program under chapter 2 of title IV of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SENSE OF CONGRESS.**

4 In light of the increasing problem of alien smuggling  
5 into the United States, it is the sense of the Congress that  
6 the Attorney General should use the provision of non-

1 immigrant status under section 101(a)(15)(S) of the Im-  
2 migration and Nationality Act in a greater number of  
3 alien smuggling investigations per year than has been  
4 done in the past.

5 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF AUTHORIZATION FOR ADMISSION**  
6 **OF “S” VISA NONIMMIGRANTS.**

7 Section 214(k)(2) of the Immigration and Nationality  
8 Act (8 U.S.C. 1184(k)(2)) is amended by striking “5” and  
9 inserting “7”.

10 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS FOR REF-**  
11 **UGEE ASSISTANCE.**

12 Section 414(a) of the Immigration and Nationality  
13 Act (8 U.S.C. 1524(a)) is amended by striking “1998 and  
14 1999” and inserting “2000 through 2002”.
