SECTION 1. STUDY OF KEALIA POND NATIONAL WILDLIFE

- 2 **REFUGE, HAWAII.**
- 3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior, act-
- 4 ing through the Director of the United States Fish and
- 5 Wildlife Service in consultation with the Director of the
- 6 United States Geological Survey, shall conduct a study to
- 7 determine ways of restoring the natural wetlands condi-
- 8 tions in the Kealia Pond National Wildlife Refuge, Ha-
- 9 waii. The study shall include examination of hydrology,
- 10 manmade impacts on wetlands, species succession, and im-
- 11 balances in natural habitat in the refuge.
- 12 (b) Report.—Not later than 1 year after amounts
- 13 are first available to implement this section, the Secretary
- 14 shall complete the study under subsection (a) and report
- 15 to the Congress findings, conclusions, and recommenda-
