1	SECTION 1. ADDITION OF CERTAIN INFORMATION TO
2	MARKERS ON GRAVES CONTAINING REMAINS
3	OF CERTAIN UNKNOWNS WHO DIED IN THE

5	DECEMBER 7, 1941.
6	(a) Requirement.—The Secretary of Veterans Af-
7	fairs shall add identifying information described in sub-
8	section (b) to the inscriptions on the markers on graves
9	in the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific con-
10	taining the remains to which that information relates.
11	(b) Information To Be Added.—The information
12	to be added pursuant to subsection (a) is the information
13	authenticated by the director of the Navy Historical Cen-
14	ter, Washington, D.C., as of the date of the enactment
15	of this Act, relating to the circumstances of death, or that
16	more particularly identifies interred remains, of certain
17	unknown casualties who died in the Japanese attack on
18	Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941
