8 "(c) AUTHORITY TO USE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFI-9 CERS.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—In meeting the program re-1 2 quirements under subsection (a), a local educational 3 agency may use up to 100 percent of the amount of 4 funds that it receives under this subpart for a fiscal 5 year to establish and operate school-based partnerships between local law enforcement agencies and 6 7 local school systems by using school resource officers who operate in and around elementary and sec-8 9 ondary schools to combat school-related crime and 10 disorder problems, gangs, and drug activities.

"(2) DEFINITION.—In this subsection, the term
'school resource officer' has the meaning given the
term in section 1709(4) of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968.".
