Mr. CANADY of Florida introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To protect infants who are born alive.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Born-Alive Infants5 Protection Act of 2000".

6 SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF BORN-ALIVE INFANT.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 1 of title 1, United
8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol9 lowing:

3 "(a) In determining the meaning of any Act of Con4 gress, or of any ruling, regulation, or interpretation of the
5 various administrative bureaus and agencies of the United
6 States, the words 'person', 'human being', 'child', and 'in7 dividual', shall include every infant member of the species
8 homo sapiens who is born alive at any stage of develop9 ment.

10 "(b) As used in this section, the term 'born alive', with respect to a member of the species homo sapiens, 11 means the complete expulsion or extraction from its moth-12 13 er of that member, at any stage of development, who after 14 such expulsion or extraction breathes or has a beating 15 heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite move-16 ment of voluntary muscles, regardless of whether the umbilical cord has been cut, and regardless of whether the 17 18 expulsion or extraction occurs as a result of natural or 19 induced labor, cesarean section, or induced abortion.".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
at the beginning of chapter 1 of title 1, United States
Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
item:

[&]quot;8. 'Person', 'human being', 'child', and 'individual' as including born-alive infant.".
