### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Paperwork Elimination3 Act of 1999".

## 4 SEC. 2. PROMOTION OF USE OF ELECTRONIC INFORMA5 TION TECHNOLOGY.

6 Section 3504(h) of title 44, United States Code, is 7 amended by striking "and" after the semicolon at the end 8 of paragraph (4), by striking the period at the end of para-9 graph (5) and inserting "; and", and by adding at the 10 end the following:

11 "(6) specifically promote the acquisition and 12 use of alternative information technologies that pro-13 vide for electronic submission, maintenance, or dis-14 closure of information as a substitute for paper and 15 for the use and acceptance of electronic signatures.".

#### 16 SEC. 3. ASSIGNMENT OF TASKS AND DEADLINES.

17 Section 3505(a)(3) of title 44, United States Code, 18 is amended by striking "and" after the semicolon at the 19 end of subparagraph (B), by striking the period at the 20 end of subparagraph (C) and inserting "; and", and by 21 adding at the end the following:

"(D) a description of progress in providing
for the acquisition and use of alternative information technologies that provide for electronic
submission, maintenance, or disclosure of information as a substitute for paper and for the use

and acceptance of electronic signatures, includ ing the extent to which such progress accom plishes reduction of burden on small businesses
 or other persons.".

### 5 SEC. 4. FEDERAL AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES.

6 (a) PROVIDING FOR USE OF ELECTRONIC INFORMA7 TION MANAGEMENT.—Section 3506(c)(1)(B) of title 44,
8 United States Code, is amended by striking "and" after
9 the semicolon at the end of clause (ii) and by adding at
10 the end the following:

"(iv) provides to persons required to
submit information the option to use,
where appropriate, electronic submission,
maintenance, or disclosure of information;
and".

(b) PROMOTION OF ELECTRONIC INFORMATION
MANAGEMENT.—Section 3506(c)(3)(C) of title 44, United
States Code, is amended by striking "or" after the semicolon at the end of clause (ii), by adding "or" after the
semicolon at the end of clause (iii), and by adding at the
end the following:

"(iv) the promotion and optional use,
where appropriate, of electronic submission, maintenance, or disclosure of information.".

(c) USE OF ALTERNATIVE INFORMATION TECH NOLOGIES.—Section 3506(c)(3)(J) of title 44, United
 States Code, is amended to read as follows:

4 "(J) to the maximum extent practicable, 5 uses information technology, including alter-6 native information technologies, that provide for 7 electronic submission, maintenance, or disclo-8 sure of information, to reduce burden and im-9 prove data quality, agency efficiency, and re-10 sponsiveness to the public.".

# SEC. 5. PUBLIC INFORMATION COLLECTION ACTIVITIES; SUBMISSION TO DIRECTOR; APPROVAL AND DELEGATION.

Section 3507(a)(1)(D)(ii) of title 44, United States Code, is amended by striking "and" after the semicolon at the end of subclause (V), by adding "and" after the semicolon at the end of subclause (VI), and by adding at the end the following:

19 "(VII) a description of how re20 spondents may, if appropriate, elec21 tronically submit, maintain, or dis22 close information under the collection
23 of information.".

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### 1 SEC. 6. RESPONSIVENESS TO CONGRESS.

Section 3514(a)(2) of title 44, United States Code,
is amended by striking "and" after the semicolon at the
end of subparagraph (C), by striking the period at the end
of subparagraph (D) and inserting "; and", and by adding
at the end the following:

7 "(E) reduced the collection of information bur8 den on small businesses and other persons through
9 the use of electronic submission, maintenance, or
10 disclosure of information as a substitute for the use
11 of paper, including—

12 "(i) a description of instances where such13 substitution has added to burden; and

14 "(ii) specific identification of such in15 stances relating to the Internal Revenue
16 Service.".

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
