1 SECTION 1. MEDICAL PAYMENTS.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (e) of the Policemen 3 and Firemen's Retirement and Disability Act (39 Stat. 718, as amended by 71 Stat. 394) is amended by adding 4 5 at the end the following new sentence: "Notwithstanding the previous sentence, in the case of any member of the 6 7 United States Park Police, payment shall be made by the 8 National Park Service upon a certificate of the Chief, 9 United States Park Police, setting forth the necessity for 10 such services or treatment and the nature of the injury 11 or disease which rendered the same necessary.".

12 (b) NATIONAL PARK SERVICE REIMBURSEMENT.— Section 6 of the Policemen and Firemen's Retirement and 13 Disability Act Amendments of 1957 (71 Stat. 399) is 14 amended by inserting after the first sentence the following 15 new sentence: "Such sums are authorized to be appro-16 priated to reimburse the National Park Service, on a 17 18 monthly basis, for medical benefit payments made from 19 funds appropriated to the National Park Service in the 20 case of any member of the United States Park Police.".

21 SEC. 2. INDEMNIFICATION.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 10(c) of the Act of August
18, 1970 (Public Law 91–383; 16 U.S.C. 1a–6(c)), is
