3 SECTION 1. MEDICAL PAYMENTS.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (e) of the Policemen 5 and Firemen's Retirement and Disability Act (39 Stat. 718, as amended by 71 Stat. 394) is amended by adding 6 at the end the following new sentence: "Notwithstanding 7 the previous sentence, in the ease of any member of the 8 9 United States Park Police, payment shall be made by the 10 National Park Service upon a certificate of the Chief, 11 United States Park Police, setting forth the necessity for 12 such services or treatment and the nature of the injury or disease which rendered the same necessary.". 13
