1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. DEFINITION OF FIRE PROTECTION ACTIVITIES.

Section 7(k) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of
1938 (29 U.S.C. 207) is amended by adding at the end
the following: "As used in this subsection, the term 'employee in fire protection activities' includes a paramedic,
emergency medical technician, rescue worker, or ambulance personnel.".

Mr. MOORE (for himself, Mr. ARCHER, Mr. GRAHAM, Mr. MORAN of Kansas, and Mr. PAUL) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

### 1 SEC. 2. CONSTRUCTION.

2 The amendment made by section 1 shall not be con3 strued to reduce or substitute for compensation
4 standards—

5 (1) contained in any existing or future agree-6 ment or memorandum of understanding reached 7 through collective bargaining by a bona fide rep-8 resentative of employees in accordance with the laws 9 of a State or political subdivision of a State; and

(2) which result in compensation greater than
the compensation available to employees under the
overtime exemption under section 7(k) of the Fair
Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. 207(k)).
