# A BILL

- To require the Secretary of the Interior to identify appropriate lands within the area designated as section 1 of the Mall in Washington, DC, as the location of a future memorial to former President Ronald Reagan, to identify a suitable location, to select a suitable design, to raise private-sector donations for such a memorial, to create a Commission to assist in these activities, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Ronald Reagan Rec-3 ognition Act of 2000".

### 4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 The Congress finds that—

6 (a) Ronald Reagan is an American hero deserv7 ing of recognition by this and future generations of
8 Americans and visitors from around the world;

9 (b) as President, Ronald Reagan initiated poli-10 cies that won the Cold War, protected and restored 11 freedom and Democracy around the globe, lowered 12 taxes on American citizens, tamed the economic 13 threats of inflation and economic stagnation, and 14 ushered in an unprecedented era of peace and pros-15 perity across the nation, and his contributions merit 16 permanent memorialization;

(c) the legacies of Ronald Reagan include restoring faith in our system of Democracy and capitalism, returning pride in being an American, and
renewing the honor and decency of the American
Presidency, and are deserving of national recognition; and

(d) the contributions of former President Ronald Reagan, and his status as a preeminent twentieth-century American statesman and one of the
greatest American Presidents, merit and require a
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1	permanent memorialization alongside the other great	
2	American leaders memorialized on the Mall in Wash-	
3	ington, DC.	
4	SEC. 3. IDENTIFICATION AND LOCATION OF THE SITE AND	
5	SELECTION OF THE DESIGN FOR A FUTURE	
6	RONALD REAGAN MEMORIAL.	
7	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Fed-	
8	eral regulations, or policy, the National Capitol Memorial	
9	Commission is hereby directed:	
10	(1) to create and recognize an exception to the	
11	moratorium on new memorials on the Washington,	
12	DC, mall for a future memorial to former President	
13	Ronald Reagan;	
14	(2) to work with the members of the Ronald	
15	Reagan Memorial Commission created under section	
16	4 of this Act, and the Secretary of the Interior, to	
17	recommend to the Congress a permanent location for	
18	a memorial to former President Ronald Reagan, to	
19	be situated in the area on the mall west of the	
20	United States Capitol and east of the Lincoln Me-	
21	morial within the area designated by section 2 of the	
22	Commemorative Works Act as Area I; and	
23	(3) to cooperate with the members of the Ron-	
24	ald Reagan Memorial Commission and the Secretary	
25	of the Interior in designing and locating a suitable	

memorial and grounds for the Ronald Reagan me morial.

3 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Fed4 eral regulations, or policy, the Secretary of the Interior
5 is hereby directed:

6 (1) to create an exception to any moratorium
7 on new memorials on the Washington, DC, mall for
8 a future memorial to former President Ronald
9 Reagan;

10 (2) to work with the members of the National 11 Capitol Memorial Commission and the members of 12 the Ronald Reagan Memorial Commission created 13 under section 4 of this Act to recommend to the 14 Congress a permanent location for a memorial to 15 former President Ronald Reagan, to be situated in 16 the area on the mall west of the United States Cap-17 itol and east of the Lincoln Memorial within the 18 area designated by section 2 of the Commemorative 19 Works Act as Area I;

20 (3) to cooperate with the members of the Na21 tional Capitol Memorial Commission and the mem22 bers of the Ronald Reagan Memorial Commission in
23 designing and locating a suitable memorial and
24 grounds for the Ronald Reagan memorial; and

(4) to assign by detail such support staff as are
 necessary to assist the members of the Ronald
 Reagan Memorial Commission in carrying out its re sponsibilities.

5 (c) Designation of a permanent location for a future
6 memorial to former President Ronald Reagan under this
7 Act shall be made in a report to the Congress and to the
8 President no later than February 6, 2002.

9 (d) The process of selection of a suitable design for 10 a future memorial to former President Ronald Reagan 11 under this Act shall begin no later than six months after 12 passage of this Act, and a final design for the Ronald 13 Reagan Memorial shall be selected and reported to the 14 Congress and the President no later than February 6, 15 2002.

16 (e) A marker—to be no smaller than three feet 17 square, and to be constructed of durable material suitable to the outdoor environment—shall be erected at the future 18 site of the memorial by the Secretary of the Interior, des-19 ignating the area as the "Future Site of the Ronald 2021 Reagan Memorial" no later than three months after selec-22 tion of the site, and such marker shall remain at the site 23 and be maintained by the Secretary until the Memorial 24 is completed, dedicated, and open to the public.

1	(f) Construction of the memorial will be completed
2	according to the schedule set forth in, and in accordance
3	with, the Commemorative Works Act.
4	SEC. 4. CREATION AND OPERATION OF THE RONALD
5	<b>REAGAN MEMORIAL COMMISSION.</b>
6	(a) There is hereby created a federal commission, to
7	be known as the Ronald Reagan Memorial Commission,
8	which shall:
9	(1) be exempt from the Federal Advisory Com-
10	mittee Act (FACA);
11	(2) be comprised of three members, including:
12	(A) the Chairman of the National Capitol
13	Memorial Commission;
14	(B) one member appointed by the Speaker
15	of the House no later than September 1, 2000;

14	(8) select a design from proposals solicited and
15	accepted from qualified American architects; and
16	(9) issue a report to Congress and the Presi-
17	dent on its activities every six months from its first
18	meeting, and issue a final report to the Congress
19	and the President including the proposed final de-
20	sign and location for the Ronald Reagan Memorial
21	no later than February 6, 2002.
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
