October 26 (legislative day, September 22), 2000.

Resolved, That the bill from the House of Representatives (H.R. 4940) entitled "An Act to designate the museum operated by the Secretary of Energy in Oak Ridge, Tennessee, as the 'American Museum of Science and Energy', and for other purposes.", do pass with the following

AMENDMENT:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

SCIENCE AND ENERGY.

(a) In General.—The Museum—

(1) is designated as the "American Museum of Science and Energy"; and

(2) shall be the official museum of science and energy of the United States.

(b) References.—Any reference in a law, map, regu-

lation, document, paper, or other record of the United

1	States to the Museum is deemed to be a reference to the				
2	"American Museum of Science and Energy".				
3	(c) Property of the United States.—				
4	(1) In general.—The name "American Mu-				
5	seum of Science and Energy" is declared the property				
6	of the United States.				
7	(2) USE.—The Museum shall have the sole right				
8	throughout the United States and its possessions to

11	(3) Effect on other rights.—This subsection				
12	shall not be construed to conflict or interfere with es-

14	SEC. 2. AUTHORITY.				
15	To carry out the activities of the Museum, the Sec-

17	(1) accept and dispose of any gift, devise, or be-				
18	quest of services or property, real or personal, that

20	(A) designated in a written document by				
21	the person making the gift, devise, or bequest as				
22	intended for the Museum; and				
23	(B) determined by the Secretary to be suit-				
24	able and beneficial for use by the Museum:				

1	(2) operate a retail outlet on the premises of the				
2	Museum for the purpose of selling or distributing				
3	items (including mementos, food, educational mate-				
4	rials, replicas, and literature) that are—				
5	(A) relevant to the contents of the Museum;

7	(B) informative, educational, and tasteful;				
8	(3) collect reasonable fees where feasible and ap-				
9	propriate;				
10	(4) exhibit, perform, display, and publish mate-				
11	rials and information of or relating to the Museum				
12	in any media or place;				
13	(5) consistent with guidelines approved by the				
14	Secretary, lease space on the premises of the Museum				
15	at reasonable rates and for uses consistent with such				
16	guidelines; and				
17	(6) use the proceeds of activities authorized				
18	under this section to pay the costs of the Museum.				
19	SEC. 3. MUSEUM VOLUNTEERS.				
20	(a) Authority To Use Volunteers.—The Secretary				
21	may recruit, train, and accept the services of individuals				
22	or entities as volunteers for services or activities related to				
23	the Museum.				
24	(b) Status of Volunteers.—				

1	(1) In general.—Except as provided in para-					
2	graph (2), service by a volunteer under subsection (a)					
3	shall not be considered Federal employment.					
4	(2) Exceptions.—					
5	(A) Federal tort claims act.—For pur-					
6	poses of chapter 171 of title 28, United States					
7	Code, a volunteer under subsection (a) shall be					
8	8 treated as an employee of the Government (as de-					
9	fined in section 2671 of that title).					
10	(B) Compensation for work injuries.—					
11	For purposes of subchapter I of chapter 81 of					
12	2 title 5, United States Code, a volunteer describe					
13	in subsection (a) shall be treated as an employee					
14	(as defined in section 8101 of title 5, United					
15	States Code).					
16	(c) Compensation.—A volunteer under subsection (a)					
17	shall serve without pay, but may receive nominal awards					
18	and reimbursement for incidental expenses, including ex-					
19	Penses for a uniform or transportation in furtherance of					
20	Museum activities.					
21	SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.					
22	For purposes of this Act:					
23	(1) Museum.—The term "Museum" means the					
24	museum operated by the Secretary of Energy and lo-					

cated at 300 South Tulane Avenue in Oak Ridge,
 Tennessee.
 (2) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
 the Secretary of Energy or a designated representative
 of the Secretary.
