7	the United States are small business owners, and

EXPANSION OF BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT BY INDI-11 VIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES. 12 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 501(d)(3)(C) of the Small Business Investment Act (15 U.S.C. 695(d)(3)(C)) is 13 amended by inserting before the comma at the end "or 14 15 business development by individuals with disabilities". 16 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section 103 of the 17 Small Business Investment Act of 1958 (15 U.S.C. 662) 18 is amended— 19 (1) in paragraph (15), by striking "and" at the 20 end; 21 (2) in paragraph (16), by striking the period at 22 the end and inserting "; and"; and 23 (3) by adding at the end the following new 24 paragraph:

"(17) the term 'disability' has the meaning
given such term in section 3(2) of the Americans
with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12102).".

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
