MONUMENT BOUNDARIES ADJUSTED.

5 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
6 "George Washington Birthplace National Monument
7 Boundary Adjustment Act of 2000".

8 (b) BOUNDARY OF GEORGE WASHINGTON BIRTH9 PLACE NATIONAL MONUMENT.—The boundary of the
10 George Washington Birthplace National Monument (here-

inafter referred to as the "monument") is modified to in-1 2 clude the area comprising approximately 115 acres, as generally depicted on the map entitled "George Wash-3 4 ington Birthplace National Monument Boundary Map Westmoreland County Virginia", numbered 332/80,011B, 5 and dated July 2000. The map shall be on file and avail-6 7 able for inspection in the appropriate offices of the Na-8 tional Park Service, Department of the Interior.

9 (c) ACQUISITION OF LANDS.—The Secretary of the 10 Interior may acquire land or interests in land described 11 in subsection (b) by donation, purchase from willing sellers 12 with donated or appropriated funds, or exchange.

(d) ADMINISTRATION OF LANDS.—Lands added to
the monument pursuant to subsection (b) shall be administered by the Secretary of the Interior as part of the
monument in accordance with the laws and regulations applicable hereto.
