A BILL

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fairness in Electricity
- 5 Supply Act of 2000".

1 SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF PREFERENCE SALES OF POWER.

- 2 (a) Amendment of Flood Control Act of
- 3 1944.—The Flood Control Act of 1944 (58 Stat. 887) is
- 4 amended by striking out "Preference in the sale of such
- 5 power and energy shall be given to public bodies and co-
- 6 operatives.".
- 7 (b) Other Authorities.—Notwithstanding any
- 8 other provision of law, no preference shall be given to a
- 9 public body or cooperative, or any other person or entity
- 10 in the purchase of electric power and energy generated at
- 11 a hydroelectric project or other facility owned by the
- 12 United States.
- 13 (c) Effective Date.—This section shall take effect
- 14 with respect to power sales contracts entered into or re-
- 15 newed after the date of the enactment of this Act.
