1 **SECTION 1. MAKING PERMANENT CERTAIN POLICING AU-**
2 **THORITY.**

3 (a) **ELIMINATION OF SUNSET PROVISION AND RE-**
4 **PORTING REQUIREMENT.**—Section 9 of the Act entitled
5 “An Act relating to the policing of the building and
6 grounds of the Supreme Court of the United States”, ap-
7 proved August 18, 1949 (40 U.S.C. 13n), is amended—

8 (1) by striking subsection (c); and

9 (2) by redesignating subsection (d) as sub-
10 section (c).

11 (b) **TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.**—Section 9 of such Act
12 is further amended in subsection (b) by striking “are here-
13 by authorized” and inserting “is authorized”.
