- 6 (a) Establishment of Term Limits.—Section 21
- 7 of title 13, United States Code, is amended by inserting
- 8 ", for a period of ten years. An individual may not serve
- 9 more than one term as Director" after "Senate".

- 1 (b) APPLICABILITY.—The amendment made by sub-
- 2 section (a) shall apply with respect to an appointment of
- 3 the Director of the Census made on or after the date of

4 the enactment of this Act.
