A BILL

To establish the National Museum of Jewish Heritage and the National Museum of Jewish Heritage Board of Directors.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Jewish Heritage Mu-

5 seum Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 7 The Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) The Jewish people have made remarkable
- 9 artistic, scientific, intellectual, and cultural contribu-
- 10 tions to the United States and the world.

Mr. YOUNG of Alaska (for himself, Mr. GIBBONS, Mr. SAXTON, Mr. POMBO, and Mr. DOOLITTLE) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

1	(2) There is no major museum in the District
2	of Columbia that is dedicated to recording and cele-
3	brating these contributions and educating the public
4	about the heritage of the Jewish people.
5	(3) Such a museum would educate the public on
6	the artistic, scientific, intellectual, and cultural con-
7	tributions that the Jewish people have made to the
8	United States and the world and would record these
9	contributions for posterity.
10	(4) Such a museum would be operated and
11	maintained by private citizens.
12	SEC. 3. NATIONAL MUSEUM OF JEWISH HERITAGE.
13	The Congress recognizes the National Museum of
14	Jewish Heritage established by the Board under section
15	4 as a national museum.
16	SEC. 4. NATIONAL MUSEUM OF JEWISH HERITAGE BOARD
17	OF DIRECTORS.
18	(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established a board
19	of directors to be known as the National Museum of Jew-
20	ish Heritage Board of Directors.
21	(b) DUTIES.—The Board shall—
22	(1) identify a site in the District of Columbia
23	for a National Museum of Jewish Heritage;
24	(2) establish and construct the Museum;
25	(3) operate and maintain the Museum;

1	(4) establish annual budgets for the Museum;
2	(5) adopt by laws to carry out the functions of
3	the Board; and
4	(6) establish policy on the utilization of the col-
5	lections of the Museum, including policy on pro-
6	gramming, education, exhibitions, and research re-
7	garding the life and culture of the Jewish people and
8	the contributions of the Jewish people to the United
9	States and the world.
10	(c) APPROVAL.—The siting of the Museum shall be
11	subject to the approval of the Director of the National
12	Park Service.
13	(d) Members.—
14	(1) Composition.—The Board shall be com-
15	posed of 25 voting members and 10 ex officio non-
16	voting members, as follows:
17	(A) 5 members appointed by the President.
18	(B) The Chair of the Board of Directors of
19	the Corporation.
20	(C) 19 members appointed by the Chair of
21	the Board of Directors of the Corporation.
22	(D) 5 ex officio nonvoting members ap-
23	pointed by the Speaker of the House of Rep-

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1	(E) 5 ex officio nonvoting members ap-
2	pointed by the President pro tempore of the
3	Senate, on recommendation of the majority
4	leader and the minority leader of the Senate.
5	(2) TERMS.—Each member of the Board ap-
6	pointed under paragraph (1) shall serve for a term
7	of 2 years and may be reappointed.
8	(3) VACANCIES.—A vacancy in the Board shall
9	be filled in the manner in which the original appoint-
10	ment was made. Any member appointed to fill a va-
11	cancy occurring before the expiration of the term for
12	which the member's predecessor was appointed shall
13	be appointed only for the remainder of that term.
14	(4) COMPENSATION.—Members of the Board
15	shall serve without pay.
16	(5) QUORUM.—8 of the voting members of the
17	Board shall constitute a quorum but a lesser number
18	may hold hearings.
19	(6) CHAIR.—
20	(A) INITIAL CHAIR.—During the 2-year
21	period beginning on the date of the enactment
22	of this Act, the Chair of the Board of Directors
23	of the Corporation shall serve as the Chair of
24	the Board of the Museum.

(B) SUBSEQUENT CHAIRS.—The Chair of
the Board of the Museum after such period
shall be elected by the Board from among its
members.
(e) Director and Staff.—The Board may appoint
and fix the pay of a Director to manage the Museum, and
any additional personnel as the Board considers appro-
priate.
(f) POWERS.—
(1) HEARINGS.—The Board may, for the pur-
pose of carrying out this Act, hold hearings and sit
and act at such times and places as the Board con-
siders appropriate.
(2) Powers of members and agents.—Any
member or agent of the Board may, if authorized by
the Board, take any action which the Board is au-
thorized to take by this section.
(3) Operation of Museum.—The Board
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(3) OPERATION OF MUSEUM.—The Board may—
may—
may— (A) loan, exchange, sell, or otherwise dis-
may— (A) loan, exchange, sell, or otherwise dis- pose of any part of the collections of the Mu-
may— (A) loan, exchange, sell, or otherwise dis- pose of any part of the collections of the Mu- seum;

(C) provide for restoration, preservation,
 and maintenance of the collections of the Mu seum.

4 (4) Administrative support services.—The 5 Board may request the Administrator of General 6 Services to provide to the Board, on a reimbursable 7 basis, the administrative support services necessary 8 for the Board to carry out its responsibilities. Upon 9 the request of the Board, the Administrator of Gen-10 eral Services shall provide such services to the Board 11 on a reimbursable basis.

(5) CONTRACT AUTHORITY.—The Board may
contract with and compensate government and private agencies or persons for supplies and services.

15 (6) FUNDING.—

16 (A) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in
17 subparagraph (B), the Board shall fund the
18 Museum solely through private contributions.

(B) FEDERALLY OWNED OR LEASED PROPERTY.—In consultation with the Director of the
National Park Service, the Board may accept
any contribution of Federally owned or leased
property in the District of Columbia for the
purpose of carrying out this Act.

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1 (C) FEES.—The Board may collect and 2 use fees for purposes of establishing, con-3 structing, operating, and maintaining the Mu-4 seum.

5 (D) GIFTS, BEQUESTS, AND DEVISES.— 6 The Board shall solicit, accept, administer, in-7 vest, and use gifts, bequests, and devises of 8 services and property, both real and personal, 9 to aid or facilitate the establishment, construc-10 tion, maintenance, and operation, of the Mu-11 seum.

(E) NOT APPROPRIATED FUNDS.—Funds
collected or accepted by the Board under this
paragraph shall not be considered appropriated
funds and are not subject to any requirements
or restrictions applicable to appropriated funds.

17 SEC. 5. COMMEMORATIVE WORKS ACT.

18 The Museum is not a commemorative work for pur-19 poses of the Commemorative Works Act (40 U.S.C. 100120 et seq.).

21 SEC. 6. DEFINITIONS.

22 For purposes of this Act:

(1) BOARD.—The term "Board" means the National Museum of Jewish Heritage Board of Directors established by section 4.

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(2) CORPORATION.—The term "Corporation"
 means National Museum of Jewish Heritage, Incor porated (a nonprofit corporation established under
 the laws of the State of Maryland).

5 (3) MUSEUM.—The term "Museum" means the
6 National Museum of Jewish Heritage established
7 under section 4 by the Board.

8 SEC. 7. NO AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

9 Nothing in this Act shall be construed as an author-10 ization of appropriations.

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
