## A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to extend the limitation on waivers granted under section 212(h) of that Act to aliens unlawfully present in the United States.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. LIMITATION ON WAIVER OF INADMISSIBILITY
- 4 FOR CRIMINAL ALIENS UNLAWFULLY
- 5 PRESENT IN THE UNITED STATES.
- 6 (a) In General.—Section 212(h) of the Immigra-
- 7 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(h)) is amended
- 8 by inserting before the final sentence the following:

- 1 "No waiver shall be granted under this subsection in the
- 2 case of any alien who is present in the United States after
- 3 the expiration of the period of stay authorized by the At-
- 4 torney General or is present in the United States without
- 5 being admitted or paroled if either the alien has been con-
- 6 victed of an aggravated felony committed in the United
- 7 States or the alien has not resided continuously in the
- 8 United States for a period of not less than 7 years imme-
- 9 diately preceding the date of initiation of proceedings to
- 10 remove the alien from the United States.".
- 11 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 12 subsection (a) shall apply to waivers granted on or after
- 13 the date of the enactment of this Act.
