A BILL

- To provide for a reduction in the volume of steel imports, and to establish a steel import notification and monitoring program.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. REDUCTION IN VOLUME OF STEEL IMPORTS.

2 (a) REDUCTION.—Notwithstanding any other provi-3 sion of law, within 60 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the President shall take the necessary steps, 4 5 by imposing quotas, tariff surcharges, negotiated enforceable voluntary export restraint agreements, or otherwise, 6 7 to ensure that the volume of steel products imported into 8 the United States during any month does not exceed the 9 average volume of steel products that was imported monthly into the United States during the 36-month pe-10 11 riod preceding July 1997.

12 (b) ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY.—Within 60 days 13 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Treasury, through the United States Customs Serv-14 ice, and the Secretary of Commerce shall implement a pro-15 16 gram for administering and enforcing the restraints on imports under subsection (a). The Customs Service is au-17 18 thorized to refuse entry into the customs territory of the 19 United States of any steel products that exceed the allow-20 able levels of imports of such products.

21 (c) Applicability.—

(1) CATEGORIES.—This section shall apply to
the following categories of steel products: semifinished, plates, sheets and strips, wire rods, wire
and wire products, rail type products, bars, struc-

tural shapes and units, pipes and tubes, iron ore,
 and coke products.

3 (2) VOLUME.—Volume of steel products for
4 purposes of this section shall be determined on the
5 basis of tonnage of such products.

6 (d) EXPIRATION.—This section shall expire at the
7 end of the 3-year period beginning 60 days after the date
8 of the enactment of this Act.

9 SEC. 2. STEEL IMPORT NOTIFICATION AND MONITORING 10 PROGRAM.

11 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 30 days after the 12 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Commerce, 13 in consultation with the Secretary of the Treasury, shall establish and implement a steel import notification and 14 15 monitoring program. The program shall include a requirement that any person importing a product classified under 16 17 chapter 72 or 73 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of 18 the United States obtain an import notification certificate before such products are entered into the United States. 19 20 (b) STEEL IMPORT NOTIFICATION CERTIFICATES.— 21 (1) IN GENERAL.—In order to obtain a steel 22 import notification certificate, an importer shall sub-23 mit to the Secretary of Commerce an application 24 containing-

25 (A) the importer's name and address;

1	(B) the name and address of the supplier
2	of the goods to be imported;
3	(C) the name and address of the producer
4	of the goods to be imported;
5	(D) the country of origin of the goods;
6	(E) the country from which the goods are
7	to be imported;
8	(F) the United States Customs port of
9	entry where the goods will be entered;
10	(G) the expected date of entry of the goods
11	into the United States;
12	(H) a description of the goods, including
13	the classification of such goods under the Har-
14	monized Tariff Schedule of the United States;
15	(I) the quantity (in kilograms and net
16	tons) of the goods to be imported;
17	(J) the cost insurance freight (CIF) and
18	free alongside ship (FAS) values of the goods to
19	be entered;
20	(K) whether the goods are being entered
21	for consumption or for entry into a bonded
22	warehouse or foreign trade zone;
23	(L) a certification that the information
24	furnished in the certificate application is cor-
25	rect; and

(M) any other information the Secretary of
 Commerce determines to be necessary and appropriate.

4 (2) ENTRY INTO CUSTOMS TERRITORY.—In the 5 case of merchandise classified under chapter 72 or 6 73 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United 7 States that is initially entered into a bonded ware-8 house or foreign trade zone, a steel import notifica-9 tion certificate shall be required before the merchan-10 dise is entered into the customs territory of the 11 United States.

(3) ISSUANCE OF STEEL IMPORT NOTIFICATION
CERTIFICATE.—The Secretary of Commerce shall
issue a steel import notification certificate to any
person who files an application that meets the requirements of this section. Such certificate shall be
valid for a period of 30 days from the date of
issuance.

19 (c) STATISTICAL INFORMATION.—

20 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Commerce
21 shall compile and publish on a weekly basis informa22 tion described in paragraph (2).

(2) INFORMATION DESCRIBED.—Information
described in this paragraph means information obtained from steel import notification certificate ap-

1 plications concerning steel imported into the United 2 States and includes with respect to such imports the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States 3 4 classification (to the tenth digit), the country of origin, the port of entry, quantity, value of steel im-5 6 ported, and whether the imports are entered for con-7 sumption or are entered into a bonded warehouse or 8 foreign trade zone. Such information shall also be 9 compiled in aggregate form and made publicly avail-10 able by the Secretary of Commerce on a weekly basis 11 by public posting through an Internet website. The 12 information provided under this section shall be in 13 addition to any information otherwise required by 14 law.

(d) FEES.—The Secretary of Commerce may prescribe reasonable fees and charges to defray the costs of
carrying out the provisions of this section, including a fee
for issuing a certificate under this section.

(e) SINGLE PRODUCER AND EXPORTER COUNTRIES.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
Secretary of Commerce shall make publicly available all
information required to be released pursuant to subsection
(c), including information obtained regarding imports
from a foreign producer or exporter that is the only pro-

ducer or exporter of goods subject to this section from a
 foreign country.

3 (f) REGULATIONS.—The Secretary of Commerce may
4 prescribe such rules and regulations relating to the steel
5 import notification and monitoring program as may be
6 necessary to carry the provisions of this section.

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
