H. RES. 151

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1569) to prohibit the use of funds appropriated to the Department of Defense from being used for the deployment of ground elements of the United States Armed Forces in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia unless that deployment is specifically authorized by law; for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 82) directing the President, pursuant to section 5(c) of the War Powers Resolution, to remove United States Armed Forces from their positions in connection with the present operations against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia; for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 44) declaring a state of war between the United States and the Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia; and for consideration of the concurrent resolution (S. Con. Res. 21) authorizing the President of the United States to conduct military air operations and missile strikes against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro).

Mr. DREIER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1569) to prohibit the use of funds appropriated to the Department of Defense from being used for the deployment of ground elements of the United States Armed Forces in the Fed-

eral Republic of Yugoslavia unless that deployment is specifically authorized by law; for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 82) directing the President, pursuant to section 5(c) of the War Powers Resolution, to remove United States Armed Forces from their positions in connection with the present operations against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia; for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 44) declaring a state of war between the United States and the Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia; and for consideration of the concurrent resolution (S. Con. Res. 21) authorizing the President of the United States to conduct military air operations and missile strikes against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro).

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order to debate the deployment of United
3 States Armed Forces in and around the territory of the
4 Federal Republic of Yugoslavia for one hour equally di-
5 vided and controlled among the chairmen and ranking mi-
6 nority members of the Committees on International Rela-
7 tions and Armed Services.

8 SEC. 2. After debate pursuant to the first section of
9 this resolution, it shall be in order without intervention
10 of the question of consideration to consider in the House
11 the bill (H.R. 1569) to prohibit the use of funds appro-
12 priated to the Department of Defense from being used for
13 the deployment of ground elements of the United States
14 Armed Forces in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia un-

1 less that deployment is specifically authorized by law. The
2 bill shall be considered as read for amendment. The pre-
3 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill
4 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
5 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair-
6 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
7 Armed Services; and (2) one motion to recommit.

8 SEC. 3. After disposition of H.R. 1569, it shall be
9 in order without intervention of any point of order or the
10 question of consideration to consider in the House the con-
11 current resolution (H. Con. Res. 82) directing the Presi-
12 dent, pursuant to section 5(c) of the War Powers Resolu-
13 tion, to remove United States Armed Forces from their
14 positions in connection with the present operations against
15 the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. The concurrent reso-
16 lution shall be considered as read for amendment. The
17 concurrent resolution shall be debatable for one hour
18 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
19 ing minority member of the Committee on International
20 Relations. The previous question shall be considered as or-
21 dered on the concurrent resolution to final adoption with-
22 out intervening motion.

23 SEC. 4. After disposition of H. Con. Res. 82, it shall
24 be in order without intervention of any point of order or
25 the question of consideration to consider in the House the

1 joint resolution (H.J. Res. 44) declaring a state of war
2 between the United States and the Government of the
3 Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. The joint resolution shall
4 be considered as read for amendment. The previous ques-
5 tion shall be considered as ordered on the joint resolution
6 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
7 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair-
8 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
9 International Relations; and (2) one motion to recommit.

10 SEC. 5. After disposition of H.J. Res. 44, it shall be
11 in order on the same legislative day without intervention
12 of the question of consideration to consider in the House
13 the concurrent resolution (S. Con. Res. 21) authorizing
14 the President of the United States to conduct military air
15 operations and missile strikes against the Federal Repub-
16 lic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), if called up by
17 Representative Gejdenson of Connecticut or his designee.
18 The concurrent resolution shall be considered as read for
19 amendment. The concurrent resolution shall be debatable
20 for one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair-
21 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
22 International Relations. The previous question shall be
23 considered as ordered on the concurrent resolution to final
24 adoption without intervening motion.

1 SEC. 6. The provisions of sections 6 and 7 of the War
2 Powers Resolution (50 U.S.C. 1545–46) shall not apply
3 during the remainder of the One Hundred Sixth Congress
4 to a measure introduced pursuant to section 5 of the War
5 Powers Resolution (50 U.S.C. 1544) with respect to Fed-
6 eral Republic of Yugoslavia.

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
