RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2005) to establish a statute of repose for durable goods used in a trade or business.

1 Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of 3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee 4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2005) to establish a statute of 6 repose for durable goods used in a trade or business. The 7 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. General

debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed 1 2 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman 3 and ranking minority member of the Committee on the 4 Judiciary. After general debate the bill shall be considered 5 for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of 6 7 amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in 8 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee 9 on the Judiciary now printed in the bill. The committee 10 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as read. No amendment to the committee amendment 11 in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those 12 13 printed in the portion of the Congressional Record designated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII and 14 15 except pro forma amendments for the purpose of debate. Each amendment so printed may be offered only by the 16 17 Member who caused it to be printed or his designee and 18 shall be considered as read. The Chairman of the Com-19 mittee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further consideration in the Committee of the Whole a re-2021 quest for a recorded vote on any amendment; and (2) re-22 duce to five minutes the minimum time for electronic vot-23 ing on any postponed question that follows another elec-24 tronic vote without intervening business, provided that the 25 minimum time for electronic voting on the first in any se-

1 ries of questions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion 2 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such 3 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may 4 5 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to 6 7 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on 8 9 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit with 10 11 or without instructions.
