Mr. MINGE (for himself, Mr. DEFAZIO, and Ms. BALDWIN) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 773) to amend the Older Americans Act of 1965 to extend the authorizations of appropriations for that Act, and to make technical corrections.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker shall, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 773) to amend the Older Americans
6 Act of 1965 to extend the authorizations of appropriations
7 for that Act, and to make technical corrections. The first
8 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. General debate

1 shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed 2 hours
2 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
3 ing minority member of the Committee on Education and
4 the Workforce. After general debate the bill shall be con-
5 sidered for amendment under the five-minute rule. Each
6 section shall be considered as read. During consideration
7 of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Committee
8 of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the
9 basis of whether the Member offering an amendment has
10 caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional
11 Record designated for that purpose in clause 8 in rule
12 XVIII. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
13 amendment, the Committee shall rise and report the bill
14 to the House with such amendments as may have been
15 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-
16 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
17 without intervening motion, except one motion to recom-
18 mit with or without instructions.

19 SEC. 2. If the Committee of the Whole rises and re-
20 ports that it has come to no resolution on the bill, then
21 on the next legislative day the House shall, immediately
22 after the third daily order of business under clause 1 of
23 rule XIV, resolve into the Committee of the Whole for fur-
24 ther consideration of the bill.

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
