Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1106) to authorize the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to make grants to State agencies with responsibility for water source development for the purpose of maximizing available water supply and protecting the environment through the development of alternative water sources.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 1106) to authorize the Adminis-  
3 trator of the Environmental Protection Agency to make  
4 grants to State agencies with responsibility for water  
5 source development for the purpose of maximizing avail-  
6 able water supply and protecting the environment through  
7 the development of alternative water sources. The first  
8 reading of the bill will be dispensed with. Points of order  
9 against consideration of the bill for failure to comply with  
10 clause 4(a) of rule XIII are waived. General debate shall  
11 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-  
12 ly divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-  
13 nority member of the Committee on Transportation and  
14 Infrastructure. After general debate the bill shall be con-  
15 sidered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall  
16 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose  
17 of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment  
18 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Com-  
19 mittee on Transportation and Infrastructure now printed  
20 in the bill. The committee amendment in the nature of  
21 a substitute shall be considered as read. During consider-  
22 ation of the bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Com-  
23 mittee of the Whole may accord priority in recognition on  
24 the basis of whether the Member offering an amendment  
25 has caused it to be printed in the portion of the Congres-

1 sional Record designated for that purpose in clause 8 of  
2 rule XVIII. Amendments so printed shall be considered  
3 as read. The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole  
4 may: (1) postpone until a time during further consider-  
5 ation in the Committee of the Whole a request for a re-  
6 corded vote on any amendment; and (2) reduce to five  
7 minutes the minimum time for electronic voting on any  
8 postponed question that follows another electronic vote  
9 without intervening business, provided that the minimum  
10 time for electronic voting on the first in any series of ques-  
11 tions shall be 15 minutes. At the conclusion of consider-  
12 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise  
13 and report the bill to the House with such amendments  
14 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a  
15 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted  
16 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the com-  
17 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The pre-  
18 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill  
19 and amendments thereto to final passage without inter-  
20 vening motion except one motion to recommit with or  
21 without instructions.

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
