Mr. Goss, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 853) to amend the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 to provide for joint resolutions on the budget, reserve funds for emergency spending, strengthened enforcement of budgetary decisions, increased accountability for Federal spending, accrual budgeting for Federal insurance programs, mitigation of the bias in the budget process toward higher spending, modifications in paygo requirements when there is an on-budget surplus, and for other purposes.

Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this 1 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of 3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee 4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-5 ation of the bill (H.R. 853) to amend the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 to provide for joint resolutions on the 6 7 budget, reserve funds for emergency spending, strength-8 ened enforcement of budgetary decisions, increased ac-9 countability for Federal spending, accrual budgeting for 10 Federal insurance programs, mitigation of the bias in the budget process toward higher spending, modifications in 11 12 paygo requirements when there is an on-budget surplus, 13 and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. General debate shall be confined to the 14 15 bill and shall not exceed 90 minutes, with 40 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-16 17 ing minority member of the Committee on the Budget, 30 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman 18 19 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Rules, 20and 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the 21 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee 22 on Appropriations. After general debate the bill shall be 23 considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. In 24 lieu of the amendments recommended by the Committee 25 on the Budget, the Committee on Rules, and the Com-

1 mittee on Appropriations now printed in the bill, it shall 2 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose 3 of amendment under the five-minute rule an amendment 4 in the nature of a substitute consisting of the text of H.R. 5 4397. That amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as read. No amendment to that amendment 6 7 in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those 8 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules. Each 9 amendment may be offered only in the order printed in 10 the report, may be offered only by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall be debat-11 12 able for the time specified in the report equally divided 13 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to 14 15 a demand for division of the question in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against 16 17 the amendments printed in the report are waived. The 18 Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may: (1) postpone until a time during further consideration in the Com-19 20mittee of the Whole a request for a recorded vote on any 21 amendment; and (2) reduce to five minutes the minimum 22 time for electronic voting on any postponed question that 23 follows another electronic vote without intervening busi-24 ness, provided that the minimum time for electronic voting 25 on the first in any series of questions shall be 15 minutes.

At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amend-1 2 ment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such amendments as may have been adopted. 3 Any Member may demand a separate vote in the House 4 5 on any amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the amendment in the nature of a sub-6 7 stitute made in order as original text. The previous ques-8 tion shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without intervening motion 9 except one motion to recommit with or without instruc-10 11 tions.

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
